Job Purpose	• To provide an effective and efficient Speech, Language and Communication Needs therapy service to a group of Trust schools, working collaboratively with multi-agency partners to support children and young people to achieve positive outcomes.
	• To contribute and work collaboratively with the Trust's wellbeing provision leads to meet the needs of vulnerable children and young people, in particular those with Speech, Language and Communication Needs.
	• To enable the Trust to meet its statutory obligations with particular reference to diagnostic assessments.

# Main Responsibilities

- To provide clinical input to a defined caseload of children and young people who present with speech, language, communication needs. This will include consultation with professionals, case formulation, assessment and intervention.
- Be responsible for assessment, diagnosis, planning, implementation and evaluation of treatment / intervention programmes for children and young people according to professional standards whilst adhering to Trust policies and procedures.
- To lead to the development of provision for children and young people with speech, language and communication needs and other provision initiatives as appropriate.
- Provide therapy intervention plans to be carried out by Learning Support Assistants/Teaching Assistants while retaining overall responsibility for the provision.
- Provide feedback, guidance, advice and training to parents/family members, carers and members of the multidisciplinary team in all aspects of speech, language and communication acquisition.
- Keep accurate records, provide written reports and undertake appropriate liaison with parent/carers, members of the multi-disciplinary team and voluntary organisations.
- Collaborate with children and young people their parents/carers and other staff in goal setting and intervention planning

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- Document all assessments, diagnoses, treatment / intervention plans, clinical notes, relevant contacts and summaries in accordance with professional standards
- To provide clear verbal feedback and written records of consultation as appropriate.
- To support Trust schools in the discharge of their statutory duties including the provision of statutory advice, attendance at Annual Reviews and attendance at Tribunals, when required.
- To support Trust schools in monitoring the progress of vulnerable children and young people, in particular those at risk of exclusion and Children Looked After.
- The post holder will be responsible for ensuring that any concerns of a Child Protection/Child in Need nature are reported to the designated person in line with the child protection procedures in place within Trust schools.
- To provide relevant in-service training to school staff on topics related to the role of Educational Psychology and reflect on and evaluate training provided.
- Operate within the scope of Speech & Language Therapy practice as set out by the Royal College of Speech & Language Therapist.
- To undertake any other duties that may be reasonably deemed part of the role
