# PREP SCHOOL

In the early years and Key Stage 1, education at Myddelton Pre-Prep sparks a flame, igniting a passion and hunger for knowledge to foster children's curiosity about the world. At Myddelton Pre-Prep, children confidently explore, develop their methods of enquiry, and build resilience for future learning. We set strong foundations to enable every child the opportunity to flourish socially, academically, and creatively. Come and experience what sets Myddelton Pre-Prep apart. At Myddelton Preparatory School, we understand that our role is not only to teach our students the skills and knowledge wanted by their future employers, but also to equip them with the skills needed to thrive in the 21st Century. We know that to get the best out of a child, both in terms of learning and personal development, they need to feel supported and safe.

As well as having extremely high academic expectations of all of our pupils, we pride ourselves on our broad and balanced curriculum. In addition to being taught the core subjects, English, Maths and Science by their classroom tutor, our pupils are also fortunate enough to be taught subjects such as Spanish, computing, music, drama and sport by subject-specialist teachers from the senior school.

In order to help our young Myddeltonians become well-rounded individuals who are able to thrive in the 21st Century, they are introduced to mindfulness from an early age. We teach the Paws B curriculum which has been developed by the Mindfulness in Schools Project. We believe that teaching mindfulness from a young age gives our students the ability to handle their emotions, and become well-balanced individuals. Individuals who feel heard and cared for, can get on with their day and work enthusiastically, without undue worries.



# SENIOR SCHOOL

Senior School is an exciting stage in the educational journey. From the first year in Senior School, students start making choices about what they study, with GCSE options considered in the Spring term of Year 9. It is also a time where the pressure on students can be at its greatest: which is why we place importance on mindfulness and excellent pastoral support within the curriculum.

Our philosophy at Myddelton College is to inspire in our students a love of learning. We do this through our small class sizes, passionately committed staff and a broad curriculum that offers a strong core of academic subjects alongside creative and other options. This desire to learn carries our students through to successful results in exams and on to the universities and careers of their choice.

Lessons are designed to use each student's full capabilities, and field trips are memorable visits that bring studies to life. Students are encouraged to take an active part in the classroom conversation, as well as participating in extracurricular activities. Students will undergo classes on; personal profiling, understanding their skills, and developing an individual development plan. This plan focuses on providing a platform to help students realise their full potential in entering the A Level years.

# SIXTH FORM (A-LEVEL)

The Sixth Form at Myddelton College provides the bridge between school and the outside world, whether that's university or employment. It is a time for students to develop their interests and challenge themselves as young adults as they approach the next important stage of their lives.

Success at A level naturally forms a central focus of students' time in the Sixth Form.

The majority of our students choose to follow three linear A levels. A small number of students will take four subjects at A level. We offer a broad and challenging array of different A level options, together with a small number of BTEC courses.

Our small size tutorial classes not only offer a taste of the teaching style at university but also mean that as in other areas of the school, personal attention is high.

Almost all of our students choose to go onto university but the application route can be tricky to navigate. However, we provide individualised UCAS & Careers support, including Oxbridge and USA Universities guidance and preparation. Our Personal Statement workshops are followed by one to one advice and support from experienced practitioners so that applications made by students are the very strongest they can be.

Sixth Form at Myddelton College brings other opportunities too.

Students in the Sixth Form take on key areas of responsibility with the opportunity to be Prefects, Peer Mentors, Sports Captains, Performance Directors and Commanders in the Combined Cadet Force (CCF). There is an extensive range of academic, co-curricular activities to stretch our pupils and ensure that they are prepared to be 21st century global leaders.

From entry into the Sixth Form there is expert career advice and guidance given from the Head of Sixth Form, University advisers and Oxbridge graduates. Students receive an in depth UCAS training programme, with coordinated Open Days and Career Exhibition Days. The decisions on university choices are made during Year 12, leading to all applications being sent during the first term in Year 13. Students are encouraged to participate in some planned work experience in the careers that they seek to embark in when they leave school. The grades they achieve in the Sixth Form are pivotal in terms of opening doors to the next stage in your life, whether that is into university or employment.



Our teachers support and guide students in their academic journey by delivering top quality teaching. We are also equipped to give additional help and support when required. Short courses are offered as boosters to students, which sit alongside normal lessons. This additional support, as well as the small class sizes, ensure that all students receive the tailored education they need to succeed.

Student support is assessed on an individual basis and reviewed accordingly. We have dyslexia specialists and a team of learning support assistants who offer provision in small groups and on a one-to-one basis with the Prep department.

# Student Wellbeing

We take the mental health of our students and staff very seriously. We have a whole school approach to supporting our students' mental health through our three pillars focusing on resilience as an important aspect of this delivery. We teach our students to cope with change, adversity and overcoming barriers and enable them to feel more confident.

We offer programmes in mindfulness and wellbeing to reduce stress and anxiety as well as focusing on positive thinking techniques.

# EAL

International pupils are supported through our EAL department and are provided with tailored weekly instruction as part of their regular timetable. Typical provision in that students in Year 3 to 9 receive one hour per week supporting their development of general English. Students in Year 10 to 11 receive 4 hours per week GCSE English and academic English support. Students in the Sixth Form receive 3 hours per week to support them securing the IELTs qualification they will need for university admission and also to reinforce the use of academic English.



There is a vibrant extra-curricular programme across the entire school which enriches all students' educational experience and enables them to try out new things, develop their talent, leadership skills, teamwork and resilience.

Myddelton College is proud of its reputation of excellence in Art, Music and Drama, subjects which have truly thrived over the past years, and we are incredibly proud of the achievements in all areas of performance.

We pride ourselves on producing polished and professional in-house performances and we always have fantastic responses from our audiences.

Myddelton offers a wide range of activities including Sports, Performing Arts, Music, Debate Society, Academic Enrichment, Calm Café, English as an Additional Language, Vocabulary Club, Photography Club, Bee-keeping, Creative Writing, School Magazine, and Gardening.

For students Year 8 and above, a military programme of activities for young people that compliments Myddelton College's three pillars CCF offers students a broad range of challenging, exciting and educational activities, including drill, skill at arms, rifle shooting and field craft.

Duke of Edinburgh is recognised widely by universities and employers. The DofE award enables young people to build character, independence, confidence, inter-personal skills, develop their knowledge and give back to their local community, reinforcing Myddelton College's three pillars of Resilience, Fellowship and Scholarship.

# Elite Sports

Myddelton College students embrace sports and fitness and make use of our 37½ acre campus. We have a full-size football pitch, rugby pitch, 4 tennis courts, an indoor climbing wall, a large indoor sports hall, a dance studio and gym area as well as a brand new Equestrian facility!

Our students benefit from our facilities, improving their physical health as well as their mental wellbeing. During their time with us, your child will participate in activities which promote teamwork and independence, build agility, communication skills and coordination.

The Elite Sports Department offers a wide range of programmes to support students' academic learning and ensure they enjoy their time at the college and are physically fit. The students gain a diverse range of experiences that will benefit them physically, socially and develop discipline and leadership skills needed to be successful in the future, be it in further education or employment. The college has many athletes that compete in national teams including triathlon, swimming, gymnastics, horse riding, sailing, climbing and ice skating among others.



Every House here is more than just a place to live; it's a family! We create a vibrant, diverse environment where students from all corners of the world and from all walks of life come together. The connections formed here are deep and lasting.

Boarders at Myddelton College are part of a large family community; we encourage a sense of belonging and a feeling of personal fulfilment in a happy, stable, caring and friendly environment. Whilst the academic side of things is a high priority, we want all students to fully participate in a wide variety of sporting, cultural and leisure activities.

Each boarding house has a residential houseparent, who is supported by an assistant residential houseparent who helps support our boarders with all of their daily needs.

There are two boarding houses at Myddelton College. We have St. George's House and Stanley's House. St. George's is our Junior boarding house and is for our students aged 11 – 16. Stanley's House is our senior boarding house and is for our students aged 15–18.

But what truly sets Myddelton College apart is the sheer abundance of opportunities. Our resources, and the dedication of our staff are second to none. We believe that a truly great education isn't just learned, it's lived. At Myddelton College, the boarding experience is the foundation of that life. Full boarding is not just something we do, it's who we are, and it's how we nurture growth, friendships, and a lifelong passion for learning.

Myddelton College is a limited company, a member of the IQ Schools' Group, and has a sister school in Shropshire called Adcote School for Girls. Although both schools are part of the same group, each is run independently and with complete autonomy. They are not connected financially.

The Head is supported by an Advisory Board of professional people, all with experience in education, thus possessing the relevant competences to exercise sound guidance and advice.
