AN INTRODUCTION TO STONYHURST COLLEGE



Stonyhurst is a Catholic, Jesuit, HMC (Headmasters' and Headmistresses' Conference), independent boarding and day school for boys and girls from 3 to 18. At the College, there are almost 500 pupils aged 13-18, over two thirds of whom are boarders. At Stonyhurst St Mary's Hall, the adjacent preparatory school, there are about 260 pupils aged 3-13. The College is in stunning countryside, near the Ribble and Hodder rivers and the beautiful Trough of Bowland. Manchester is only about an hour away by road or rail. The market town of Clitheroe is 4 miles away, and we are 12 miles from the city of Preston. The Lake District can be reached in about an hour, and the Yorkshire Dales are even closer.

Stonyhurst has a fascinating heritage, being the oldest continuously existing Jesuit school in the world. It was founded in St Omers, northern France, in 1593, and moved to its present site in Lancashire's beautiful Ribble Valley in 1794. The original quadrangle at the centre of the College is part of a 16th century mansion, donated to Stonyhurst at the beginning of the 19th century by Mr Thomas Weld of Lulworth. Throughout the years of religious persecution in England, Stonyhurst educated boys from Roman Catholic families. In 1996, Stonyhurst became fully coeducational, and today it educates boys and girls from Catholic families, and also those of other denominations.

The College's Jesuit mission and identity, and its sense of community, set Stonyhurst apart from other schools. Pupils are urged to do as much as they can for other people following the example of Jesus Christ, 'the Man for others'.



THE FACULTY

The English Faculty holds a special position at Stonyhurst College given the school's rich literary heritage. Whether it be Baskerville Hall in Sir Arthur Conan-Doyle's *The Hound of the Baskervilles*, the Shire in J.R.R. Tolkien's *The Lord of the Rings* or the natural beauty captured in the poetry of Gerard Manley Hopkins, Stonyhurst and its surroundings are part of the landscape of our literary history.

The Faculty itself is close knit and achieves a huge amount despite having only four full time members of staff. There are three main classrooms, all with interactive whiteboards and WiFi connectivity, and there is also a Faculty library to complement the collection in the main school library and the three historic libraries. Currently, the Faculty follows the Edexcel IGCSE courses for English Language and English Literature and also offers the IGCSE English Language course in a year for our Pre IB pupils. In the sixth form, both IB (Higher and Standard Level) and A Level (Edexcel English Literature) are offered.



Results in the Faculty are strong and continue to improve.

- A-Level 2017 A*-C: 75%
- IGCSE 2017 A*-C: Language 97%; Literature 100%
- Average IB points 2017: HL 5.9; SL 6.4.

The Faculty is particularly involved in the wider life of the school running several creative writing competitions, debating, public speaking, Schools' Challenge and the Oxbridge Reading Group.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Staff

- Promote the Stonyhurst mission and enable teaching staff to do the same by encouraging members of the Faculty to live by the school motto, "Quant Je Puis".
- Assist with the recruitment and appointment of staff in the Faculty.
- Create a cohesive English Faculty team with shared standards and values.
- Support colleagues in their mission to ensure that all pupils achieve their academic potential.
- Keep up to date with developments and best practice in English teaching.

Management

- Determine the aims and objectives of the Faculty, ensuring compatibility with those of the College.
- Produce Faculty development plans.
- Chair Faculty meetings.
- Be responsible for quality assurance of teaching and learning across the Faculty.
- Oversee resourcing, budgeting and the quality of the learning environment in the Faculty.
- Revise the English Faculty handbook, schemes of work and learning plans as appropriate.



Pupils

- Teach up to an 80% timetable.
- Use data to monitor pupils' achievements and set individual targets.
- Complete examination entries for all year groups.
- Offer advice, support and guidance for pupils wishing to study English at university.
- Attend parents' consultations, open days and whole school events.
- Establish an annual programme of events to broaden pupils' interest in English and to raise the profile of the Faculty externally and in school.
- Manage the KS3 Co-ordinator and liaise with key colleagues at Stonyhurst St Mary's Hall Prep School to ensure a seamless transition into year 9 at the College.
- Play a full part in the co-curricular life of this busy boarding school.

- Proven ability to lead and manage a team.
- A genuine enjoyment of working with others for the betterment of young people.
- A commitment to safeguarding the welfare of young people.
- A high level of organisation.
- Ability to work under pressure balancing a number of commitments.
- A positive approach to problem solving.
- An international outlook and a positive mind-set.

Weekly Commitment

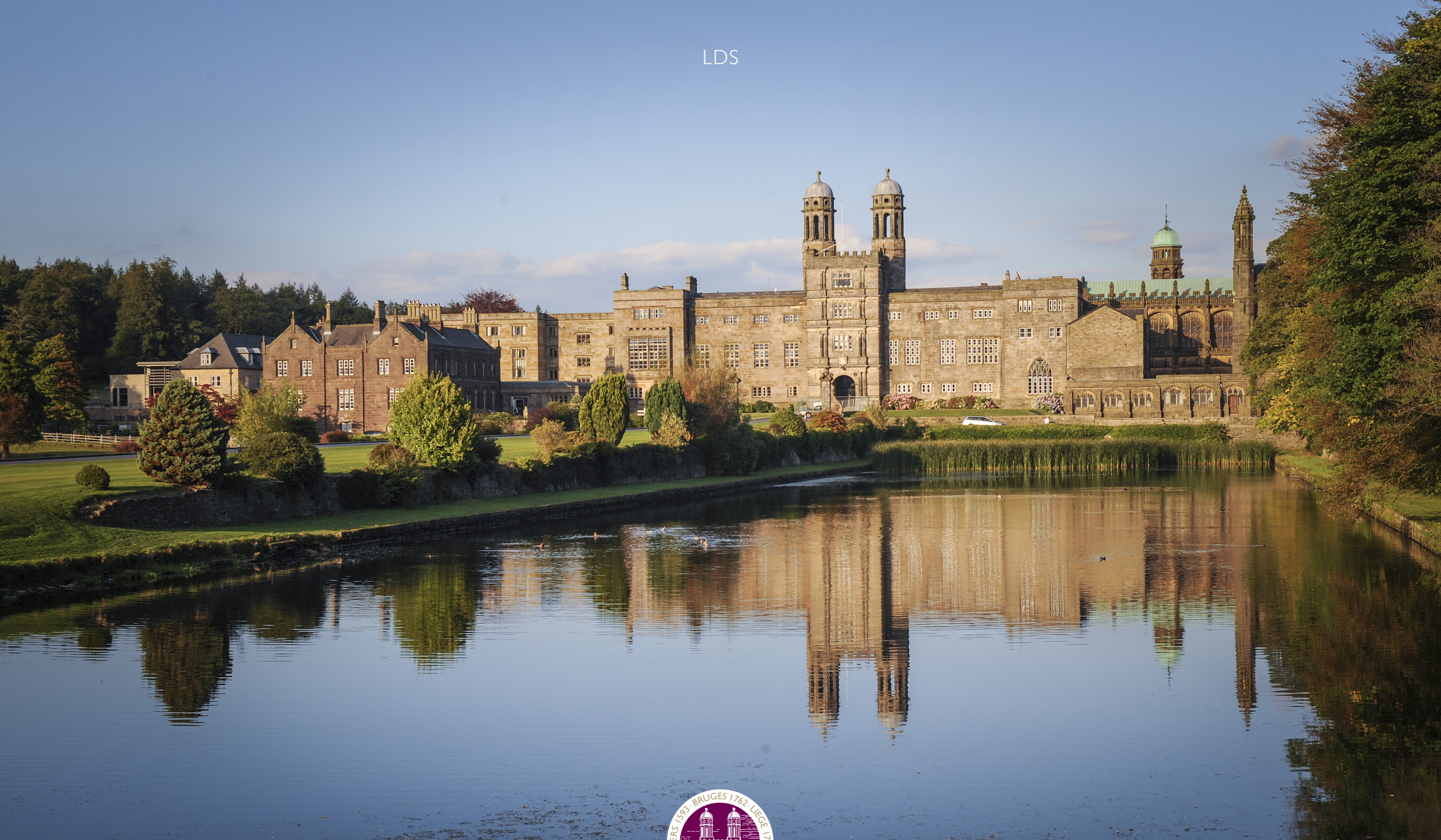
