Job Title: GAP Placement - Lower School Reports to: Master of the Lower School

### **Specific Responsibilities**

- Assist (alongside the designated teacher) in a mixture of lessons such as PE, Art, ICT, DT. (Mix of lessons will be decided according to the strengths and interests of the successful candidate)
- Assist when required with Games- be involved with matches and possibly take a team

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### **Salary and Benefits**

## Salary and Working Pattern

This is a fixed term contract from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2021. The GAP Placement will be expected to work 37.5 hours per week during term time and the salary is £11,812 per annum or £12,886 per annum for a graduate. Flexibility in working hours and pattern is required to meet the changing needs of the school.

#### Pension

Subject to meeting the qualifying conditions, support staff are eligible for the Aegon pension scheme. The school will contribute 8% if the staff contributes a minimum of 4% of their salary into the scheme. Please note that this is a defined-contribution pension scheme.

#### Healthcare

Staff may benefit from a heavily subsidised private healthcare plan run by PPP. To join, a full-time member of staff has to contribute £100 per annum. The spouse and dependent children may also join the scheme at the prevailing corporate rate.

#### Lunch

Staff may enjoy a complimentary lunch in the school's Refectory during term-time.

NOTE: Please note that Norwich School is located in the centre of Norwich with very limited parking. The successful candidate may apply for a parking space but success will be dependent on availability and on meeting the school's criteria for awarding parking spaces.
