

School information

Cranleigh Primary is a through primary school with an attached 10 place CoIN Centre. We are split over two sites: one form entry at lower school (EYFS, KS1 and CoIN) and two form entry at upper school (KS2).

The school offers a Christian teaching and learning environment of the highest quality to children between the ages of four and eleven. Cranleigh Primary serves a large section of the Cranleigh community. Pupils at our school come from Cranleigh and the surrounding villages. Cranleigh Primary is a school where every child is valued. Within this happy and caring school community each child is encouraged to achieve his/ her potential. Our Christian values are very much lived out in the day to day life of our school and are evident in the behaviour and attitudes of the whole school community.

Mission and Ethos

As a church school we believe that our role is to educate the whole child and that the spiritual growth of our children is as important as their academic development. We have a well-planned curriculum that embraces spiritual, moral, social and cultural development and we aim to serve our community by providing an education of the highest quality within a framework of Christian belief and values.

Our school is rooted in Christian beliefs and these Christian principles permeate everything we do:

- 1. Love the Lord your God
- 2. Love your neighbour as yourself

In upholding these principles, we aim to develop the following Christian values in our children and in our day to day lives:

- Friendship
- Hope
- Forgiveness

These Christian values underpin the curriculum and reflect our school's commitment to developing all aspects of our pupils' lives.

This statement sets out the principles underpinning the curriculum and reflects our school's commitment to developing all aspects of our pupils' lives.

At Cranleigh C of E Primary School we aim for our children to:

This is the philosophy of how we want to work and learn. These aims underpin all of the learning that takes place in our school. The five outcomes of Every Child Matters: Being Healthy, Staying Safe, Enjoying and Achieving, Economic Well Being and Making a Contribution are reflected in each policy and procedure in our school.



Organisation

The school is split over two sites and consist of:

ColN

Communication and Interaction Needs centre (CoIN) (formerly known as a Speech and Language centre) attached to the mainstream school, at lower school. We cater for up to 10 children in the class. These children range in age from 4 to 7 years (from Reception to Year 2). All children in the centre have a full EHCP (Education, Health Care Plan) and are placed by Surrey CC.



EYFS

Reception class is based at lower school, where our Year R children start at Cranleigh Primary School at the beginning of the year in which they become five and follow the Early Years Foundation Stage. We usually take children from local nurseries and there is a successful induction programme in place.


Key Stage One

These classes are at lower school and consist of a one-form entry at Year 1 and Year 2.

Key Stage Two

These classes are based at upper school. We have eight classes from Year 3 to Year 6, with two classes for each year group. The year groups work very closely together to achieve consistency across the school.

Although the school is split across two sites, working together as a whole is very important. All classes get together for two assemblies a week, one at lower school and one at upper school. Prefects visit lower school daily to support the children at lunch









A Pupil Introduction

Hello my name is Jessica. I have been at Cranleigh C of E Primary School since reception and I have loved every minute. I have learnt so much during my time at this school due to the dedication and hard work of the teachers. The lessons are always taught in an interesting and fun way which captures your attention and brings your topics to life. A good example of this is our Stunning Starts that we have at the beginning of each topic such as our trip to Marwell Zoo earlier this term. Our classrooms are always an interesting place to be in with colourful displays and role play areas where we can act out scenes from a book or film relevant to our topic. I still remember our circus role play in reception with the costumes to dress up in. I am able to challenge myself when learning by using the targets for success which push me to try things that may be outside my comfort zone and when I do this I feel it is a great achievement.

At Cranleigh Primary School we have 4 Golden Rules which we follow and these help us to make sure we are always doing the right thing and trying our hardest. There are also the 5 R's (resourceful, resilience, risk-taker, reflective and reasoning). These encourage us to persevere and keep trying when something is hard and to always try new things. As a church school we also have 6 Christian values. We focus on a different value each half term and these play an important part in how we treat each other at school.

Since I started here there have been many great trips and residentials. This started in reception when we were lucky enough to go on a trip to the London Eye as part of our topic covering London 2012. This was very exciting. We have also been to the Sealife Centre, Greenwich Observatory, The Science Museum and lots of other interesting places. From Year 4 we are also able to go on residential Trips. In Year 4 we went to Juniper Hall in Dorking. I was a little apprehensive as this was my first time away from home but it was amazing. We participated in den building and orienteering and did animal trapping in the evening and caught a vole. In year 5 we went to PGL which was, in my opinion, the best trip ever. We got to experience lots of exciting activities such as a giant swing, quad biking, and a zip wire. In the evenings we had a disco which was great fun. We also did ambush. This year we will be going to CYE for a week. I am very excited but slightly nervous but I have heard it is fantastic.

Whilst at this school there are many opportunities to take on roles of responsibility. Each year, each class has an Eco-warrior and a school council representative. The role of an Eco – Warrior is to encourage saving electricity, recycling and coming up with ways to make the school eco-friendly. You also go on a trip to Sayers Croft. If you are a school councillor your role is to discuss ways of making the school better with your class mates and then taking those ideas to a meeting where you and other school councillors will discuss them. Also you will go on a trip to the Houses of Parliament which I went on in year 4 and was a great experience. These roles are voted for during our democracy day. Also in years 2 and 5 you can become a House captain where you are responsible for various duties. In year 5 you have the opportunity to apply to become a prefect. You are then invited to an interview and if you are successful you become a prefect. The prefects help around school fulfilling duties such as going to lower school to help at lunchtime. I am a prefect and I am loving being able to help and having the responsibility.

At this school there are a wide range of clubs such as dodgeball club and worship club. There is also a range of after school clubs which are great fun. Some of these clubs are Boogie Pumps and Ball Up, basketball. There is also the singing squad who



in January will be attending the O2 for Young Voices. I had the opportunity to do this last year and it was a great experience and I am really looking forward to going again next year.

At Cranleigh Primary there are many ways of being rewarded for good behaviour or trying your hardest. One of these rewards are Dojos, our rewards system. You can also get stickers and be put on the star. Each week each class has a star of the week which I really look forward to as you get to go to Heads picnic where you get treats!

My time at Cranleigh Primary has been amazing so far and I can't wait to see what the rest of my time at this school brings. I will be really sad to leave this school but I know that I am prepared for the next stage.







Ofsted

The school had its most recent Ofsted inspection in March 2016, at which point it was rated as Good with Outstanding features. This was a particular landmark for the school as it represented the first time in its history to have been rated at this level, with previous inspections rating the school as Satisfactory or Requiring Improvement. The school was rated across the 5 areas as follows:

Effectiveness of leadership and management - Outstanding

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment - Good

Personal development, behaviour and welfare - Outstanding

Outcomes for pupils – **Good**

Early years provision – **Outstanding**

Although this rating was a fabulous achievement, the school has not rested on its laurels and continues to strive to be recognised as an Outstanding school. In order to achieve that rating, the school is very clear that it needs to improve on the following areas:

- The precise use of assessment information by all teachers.
- Ensuring there is consistent outcomes across all groups.
- Providing more opportunities for pupil reasoning in maths.
- Providing more opportunities for pupils to make their own investigative decisions in science.



SIAMS

The school had its most recent SIAMS inspection in June 2017, and was rated as Good overall. The inspector made the following observations about the school:

- This is a welcoming school where inclusion for all, including the most vulnerable, has a priority.
- The curriculum is shaped and influenced by the school's Christian character and this has a positive impact on learning and achievement.
- Values based learning lies at the heart of the school's ethos.
- Pupils' learning attitudes help to ensure that they are actively and purposefully engaged in their learning.
- Teachers work hard to provide a stimulating environment in which children learn.
- Governance has a positive impact on the school's improvement.
- Partnership with the local church is positive and provides opportunities to join together.
- Senior leaders and governors have accomplished a great deal in developing the Christian character. They are passionate about the school and care deeply about providing the very best for all concerns.
