Quantum is a short term facility located on-site which supports students who have been temporarily removed from lessons due to behaviour choices. The purpose of Quantum is two fold. It provides a period of supervised personal reflection and working in a quiet environment followed by a period of adult led learning and restorative reflection on a 1:1 or small group basis. The aim of Quantum is to return students to lessons, ready to learn, as quickly as possible.

Applicants will be highly motivated and have a passion to ensure that our learners achieve the very best that they can at all times. The core purpose of the role will be to uphold the core standards of **pride, respect** and **achievement** with **all learners** but also ensure that all students receive the highest standard of bespoke support.

The Learning Mentor will assist in planning and leading day to day learning activities. They will be supported by the Inclusion Manager and will liaise with teaching and pastoral staff to identify solutions to support students with their behaviour choices to be able to return to mainstream learning.

- Creative in their approach to working with young people
