



Background

Afforded charitable status by the Hong Kong Government, Kellett School is a leading provider of quality British style education, in a day school setting, to the English speaking community in Hong Kong for children aged 4 to 18 years. The school occupies two purpose built campuses one on Hong Kong Island (Pok Fu Lam), the other on the Kowloon Peninsula (Kowloon Bay) which together offer 1,400 student places.

Pok Fu Lam opened in 1976 the Pok Fu Lam Campus is a three form entry Preparatory School for a maximum of 480 students aged 4 to 11 years.

Kowloon Bay opened in September 2013, the campus accommodates a further two form Preparatory School with 320 students on the roll and a Senior School which currently accommodates 570 students aged 11-18 years.

Kellett School Association Ltd

Kellett School is a registered company with limited liability that operates as a not-for-profit company, and is recognised by the Hong Kong Inland Revenue Department as a charity. All parents are members of the 'Association' and the operations of the school are overseen by a Board of fifteen Governors, three of whom are ex-officio; The Principal, The Director of Finance & Operations (Bursar) and an Education Advisor, (The Principal and the DFO (Bursar) are non-voting).

The Board of Governors are the Directors of the Company and have oversight of its operations including;

- The appointment and tenure of the Principal and Director of Finance & Operations (Bursar)
- Approve the appointment of Heads of School
- Compliance with relevant ordinances
- Financial oversight
- Approve school policy
- Commission independent inspection

Company Secretary Services are provided by Baker and Mackenzie, Hong Kong and the appointed auditors are KPMG.

The day to day operations of the school are delegated to the Principal, who working closely with the Senior Management Team (Director of Finance & Operations (Bursar), Heads of Schools, HR Manager, Admissions Director and Director of Development & Community Relations and Senior Accountant,) manages the school reporting to the Board on a regular basis. Heads of School enjoy autonomy to lead their campus within a delegated structure. The Heads of the Kowloon Bay and Pok Fu Lam Preparatory Campus and their teams work closely together. A stable video conferencing facility supports cross campus meetings.

Kellett School is a founding member of Federation of British International Schools in Asia (FOBISIA) and is inspected under the UK Government's British Schools Overseas scheme. The majority of its students are the dependants of expatriates working in Hong Kong on short to long term assignments. The Preparatory Schools are oversubscribed in the lower and mid years; admissions to the senior school are ahead of projected numbers.

Other - 13%

Rellett welcomes students of all abilities, including a limited number of students whose individual needs can be met in a main stream school setting. The school makes no EAL provision; students must be able to access the curriculum at a level appropriate to their age. A Deputy Head of School manages Inclusion across the school, including a Senior School Learning Centre designed to support a range of specialist inclusion provision, occupational therapy and speech and language therapy.

The Curriculum

The School is proud of its tradition of academic excellence and curriculum breadth. The curriculum is based upon the National Curriculum for England (NC) leading to IGCSE/GCSE and 'A' Level public examinations. It aims to provide seamless transition to and from British and British International Schools worldwide. anticipated that the majority of students upon completion of 'A' Level study will leave to leading UK, US, Australian and HK Universities.

Kellett School provides curriculum experiences well beyond the requirements of the NC and this is reflected in generous resources to support the curriculum as a whole, the performing and creative arts and sport in particular. Curriculum, residential visits and a rich provision of extra-curricular activities combine to offer an experience similar to those of a leading UK independent day school.

Kellett School subscribes to Durham Universities, Centre of Educational Management (CEM) who manage the School's student performance data through online PIPS, MidYIS, Yellis and ALIS assessment. School data indicates that the majority of student attainment is well above the UK national average. The School's Value Added Data (VA) is particularly strong.



Finance

The School maintains a healthy financial position. It is almost wholly funded by fee and Debenture income. There is a small amount of income derived from donations, and an active Parents Association have been instrumental in funding enhanced provision for students.

The School can look to the future with confidence; building upon Kellett School's tradition of offering high quality British style education at a level comparable to respected day schools within the UK independent sector. The Pok Fu Lam Campus

The Pok Fu Lam Campus is a purpose built three form entry preparatory school for students aged four to eleven years. It was recently extensively refurbished and offers a light, bright and modern environment. The campus comprises; playground, roof playground, garden, specialist art room, two music rooms, drama studio, science lab, computer room, gymnasium, multipurpose auditorium with retractable seating, resources room, inclusion suite, cooking room, spacious library, administration suite, staff room, PD room, meeting rooms and twenty four classrooms.

The campus is generously resourced; there is a high speed network and wireless throughout. All teaching areas are fitted with interactive whiteboards. The dual IT system supports both Apple and PC technology. The prep school is equipped with itouches, ipads, macbooks and notebooks. Generous curriculum resources are available throughout, including a well-stocked library. Significant numbers of students join the instrumental programme, choir, orchestra and ensembles. PE and sport are well represented, Kellett teams play within the Hong Kong school leagues and friendly interschool matches. There is a rich ECA programme offering approximately 40 activities per week.

The curriculum and assessment structure is based upon the National Curriculum for England, although in reality the Kellett Curriculum teaches well beyond the National Curriculum framework. The curriculum embodies the school aim *A love of learning and confidence for life*. Where appropriate the curriculum is localised drawing upon the richness of Hong Kong and its environment. Field trips and visits within and beyond Hong Kong, and learning from first hand experiences form an important strand within the curriculum as does performance. Mandarin (Putonghua) is taught throughout the school. Read Write Inc is used at EYFS and Key Stage 1. Despite being non-selective our PIPS and longitudinal data indicates that the majority of children generally achieve in the upper quartile. It is a requirement that children can access the curriculum in English; currently approximately 95% of children are native English speakers. A strong Learning Support Department ensures that we can admit students of all abilities and that families may be educated together.

Kellett was founded by its parents and there remains within the school a strong legacy of parental involvement. Parents have high expectations of their children and their school; they are equally supportive giving generously of their time, expertise and funding additional opportunities.

We seek an outstanding Deputy Head of Preparatory School, with excellent interpersonal and communication skills who is committed to achieving high academic attainment within a broad and exciting curriculum. They should be conversant with the English National Curriculum, coupled with a strong knowledge of Assessment for Learning Strategies.
