- Work with the Governing Body in shaping a vision and direction for the school, setting out very high expectations and a clear focus on pupil achievement and progression.
- Ensure strong financial management and governance.
- Ensure creativity, innovation and the use of new technologies to achieve excellence.
- Set aims and objectives for the school and formulate the School Improvement Plan, liaising with Governors and other senior staff. To take responsibility for developing and monitoring policy and practice within the School Improvement Plan.
- Inspire, motivate and influence staff and pupils, to maintain the highest standards of teaching, learning and pupil discipline.
- Be responsible for Health and Safety and Safeguarding issues within school and all extended services.
- Ensure involvement of parents, carers, the community and stakeholders in the life of the school.
- Work closely with local churches and the Birmingham Diocesan Board of Education to promote the school's Christian ethos.
- Provide effective leadership and management to colleagues, ensuring guidance and support.
- Lead and manage the school's curriculum provision and all aspects of assessment.
- Lead the school's continuing professional development programme, including

training programmes, INSET to further develop staff across the school. Lead self-review and evaluation and the effective planning and management of school resources to secure improvements. Maintain an informed view of standards and of the quality of teaching across the school by monitoring planning and pupils' work and learning.
