

Brief history of our college

Ernest Bevin College has come a long way since September 1926 when the original school, Bec opened to 129 boys in five forms with a staff of seven. Bec School was an all boys school serving the local community.

Hillcroft School was built on an adjoining site and opened in September 1960 as an all boys comprehensive school. The two schools were totally separate institutions until 1971 when they amalgamated as Bec-Hillcroft.

In September 1971 the new amalgamated comprehensive school was named Ernest Bevin, and combined the Bec school building and the Hillcroft school building, a new single story building facing Beechcroft Road was built soon afterwards to join the two buildings as one school.

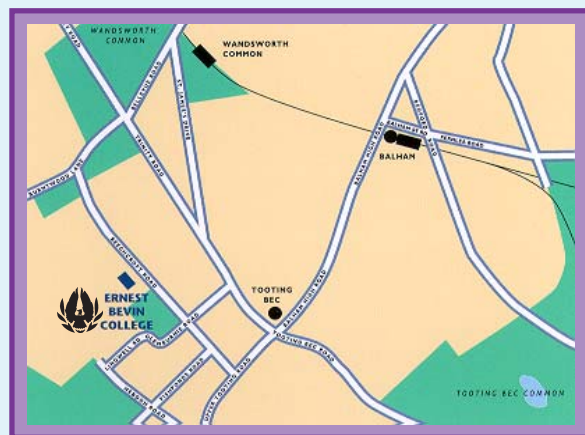
The original Bec building was demolished as part of the college refurbishment in 1996.

Students and staff moved into the newly designed Ernest Bevin School building in 1996.

The name Ernest Bevin College was launched in June 1997.

In 1999 the college became a specialist college for sport and was redesignated in 2004. In addition we also became a specialist college in Mathematics and Computing.

During 2005 a major new development took place. The building of our new Sports and Sixth Form Centre. The complex opened in September 2007.



The college is situated a short walk from Tooting Bec underground, Wandsworth Common and Balham main line stations. Numerous bus routes serve the local area.
