




PASTORAL CARE AND WELFARE

THE CURRICULUM




Abraham Darby Academy will ensure that all young people will respond to challenge as long as that challenge is relevant to their individual needs and aspirations.

All students at Abraham Darby will be offered the National Curriculum although it will take full advantage of the new national flexibility in order to provide students with a personalised learning experience. All students will also experience a range of different learning styles appropriate to the courses they are studying.



In year 7, we deliver a traditional curriculum that will begin the preparation for exam success in Maths, English, Science, the Humanities and Foreign Languages. There will be a significant focus on spelling, grammar and reading across all subject areas. Transitional provision is available in Year 7 and 8 to support vulnerable students and provide intensive literacy teaching. Distinct and different learning pathways will be developed in Key Stage 4 in order to best meet individual needs and ensure that all students are both supported and challenged. Our Key Stage 4 is three years in duration which allows this theme of distinctive learning pathways to be developed further through a range of academic and vocational learning routes.



THE ACADEMY SIXTH FORM

Abraham Darby Sixth Form continues to go from strength to strength. Our aim is to get our students prepared for the next stage of their lives. We work closely with Universities and employers to ensure that our students have the skills needed to be successful now and in the future. In addition to striving for academic excellence, we provide many opportunities for our students to develop their resilience, resourcefulness and leadership skills. Our links with Adams' Grammar School and the rest of the Haberdashers' family means we are in a unique position to be able to offer a fantastic experience for all our Sixth Form students.



EDUCATING THE WHOLE PERSON



The Academy will educate the whole person. Our extra curricular programme is wide and varied. It builds and enhances students' personal confidence and skills through participation in outdoor activities, music, dance, drama and sports. Personal responsibility will be developed through involvement in schemes such as the Junior Sports Leaders Award and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme and a range of educational excursions and sports tours.

We offer courses leading to qualifications in both Performing Arts and the individual disciplines of Dance, Drama and Music. Our music provision is held in high esteem and makes available to all students free instrumental tuition both during the school week and as part of the Saturday Music College.
