

Wolverhampton Grammar School fully supports continuing professional development for all teaching and support staff. Staff have access to in-house and externally provided training, conferences and events.


All staff have an annual review with their manager or Head of Department where areas for ongoing and future development are discussed.

The school also has an annual training budget and teaching staff are able to apply to access a fund to undertake research related to their discipline that is of benefit to the wider school community.


Benefits of Service

There are many benefits to working at Wolverhampton Grammar School, including:

- · Generous salary and pension package.
- Employees who have children in the school are eligible for a percentage remission of fees.
- Childcare Voucher scheme to help employees with dependent children.
- Service with the school is pensionable under the school's approved pension scheme.
- Lunch is provided free of charge for staff during term time.

Our Environment

Our 25 acre site, located to the west of Wolverhampton blends stunning original architecture with creative, innovative learning spaces. The city's central location means that it is well connected to the rest of the UK via both the road and rail network, and also internationally with Birmingham and Manchester airports within easy access. This central location, along with Wolverhampton's strong manufacturing heritage, has proved a big draw for many national and international companies, with Jaguar Land Rover, Marston's PLC, TATA Steel, and

UTC Aerospace, who all boast a strong global base within the city forming an integral part of the economy.



How to find us

Wolverhampton Grammar School is an impressive 19th century redbrick school surrounded by acres of green space. All visitors to the School are asked to report to the main reception.



By Rail: The nearest mainline station is Wolverhampton (5 minutes by taxi to/from the school) with regular service connections to Birmingham, the wider West Midlands, Manchester and London.

Taxis are available for hire outside the main entrance of Wolverhampton Railway Station.

Wolverhampton City Bus Station is located next to the Railway Station (5 minute walk) and can be accessed by crossing Railway Drive Bridge and taking a left down Pipers Row.

By Bus: There are several bus routes which serve the school from Wolverhampton.

By Road from the South (M6): Leave the M6 at junction 10, on the Black Country Route to the A454 signposted Wolverhampton. Continue on the A454 and bear left on to Wolverhampton Ring Road, Travel clockwise following signs to Bridgnorth. At the third roundabout take the left filter lane (signposted A454 / Bridgnorth / Compton /Tettenhall). At the threeway junction controlled by traffic lights, take the middle route onto Compton Road signposted A454 Bridgnorth, Wightwick Manor. Wolverhampton Grammar School is situated approximately 300 metres on your left.

By Road from the North (M6): Leave the M6 at junction 12, heading west on the A5 (Telford / Wolverhampton). At the first roundabout (Gailey) take the first exit on to the A449, signposted Wolverhampton. Continue on the A449 passing under the M54 bridge and into the centre of Wolverhampton. As you pass Molineux Football Stadium on your left, you will approach Wolverhampton Ring Road; immediately after the stadium proceed through the first set of traffic lights, then at the next set turn right onto the ring road signposted A454 Bridgnorth / Compton / Tettenhall. At the next roundabout take the third exit continuing to follow signs for the A454. At the three-way junction controlled by traffic lights, take the middle route onto Compton Road signposted A454 Bridgnorth, Wightwick Manor. Wolverhampton Grammar School is situated approximately 300 metres on your left.
