General aims/philosophy

The Physical Education department aims to provide a safe atmosphere in which all pupils can enjoy and achieve in sport. We also aim to challenge all pupils to follow a healthy active lifestyle both in and out of the school environment with the department boasting an exceptional range of curricular and extra-curricular opportunities for pupils. Teaching and learning and pupil progress is a top priority in all lessons and we strive to continually improve our practice. We aim to challenge pupils to reach aspirational targets. Teachers within the department work well within a team to reach these goals. Drawing upon a wide range of exciting and engaging teaching approaches, members of the department are encouraged to develop their own ideas, teaching styles and resources, all of which they share with their colleagues. Academic rigour and high expectations for all pupils underpin all decisions and approaches within the department.

Curriculum

PE is taught in single gender lessons throughout KS3 with pupils being set upon entry in year 7 and throughout the Key Stage. Pupils follow a broad and varied curriculum at KS3 with units lasting 4 weeks. In September 2019, pupils will have 2 x 1hour lessons a week at KS3.

At KS4, pupils are taught in 2 bands based on English sets. Pupils are given options to follow throughout the KS with a number of outside specialist coaches being used to deliver activities as well as pupils being taken off site for lessons. In Year 10 pupils are still allocated 2 x 1 hour lessons a week with this dropping to 1 x 1 hour in Year 11.

Pupils at KS4 can also follow examination PE studying OCR GCSE PE. In Year 10 and 11, pupils experience an extra 2/3 hours a week for theory and coursework.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The Department runs a varied and diverse range of extra curricular activities at both inter and intra levels. Traditionally the school and pupils also experiences success at district, county and national level in a variety of sport. The PE department also organises a ski trip to Austria and a summer Water Sports Trip to Austria, on alternate Years.

Examination Results

We are immensely proud of our track record of success in PE. Progress is exceptionally strong because of the consistent focus of improving and developing teaching and learning within the department. Very high expectations prevail, and teachers respond decisively at the earliest sign of underachievement.
