

Exam success

This August staff and students came together to celebrate the phenomenal results enjoyed by our GCSE students. The percentage of students achieving the top grades remains impressive, including 29% of students securing the very top grades of 7–9 in Mathematics.

We are particularly proud of the amazing progress made by students since joining the school, the new Progress 8 score which measures the progress made by students in their 8 best GCSEs would place the school amongst the top performing schools nationally.

There have been fantastic results across the curriculum, but particular highlights include:

Physics: 50% achieved 7-9 (A*-A) grades **Biology:** 38% achieved 7-9

Chemistry: 38% achieved 7-9 **Punjabi:** 36% achieved 7-9

Head of Key Stage 4, Mr Roopra, commented: "Congratulations to the class of 2018 in securing another set of outstanding results. I am extremely proud of what our students have achieved, the results are a testament of their determination, hard work and commitment, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank staff for their ongoing dedication to our students' achievements. We look forward to welcoming many of them back to the Sixth Form in September where we are sure they will continue their academic success."


Beyond the curriculum

ENRICHMENT WEEK

Combined Cadet Force coming soon!

The Combined Cadet Force (CCF) is a unique educational partnership between KSA and the Ministry of Defence, incorporating Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Army or Royal Air Force sections.

Through enjoyable military themed and adventurous activities, cadets will have the opportunity to take responsibility, develop skills such as leadership, self-reliance, resourcefulness, endurance and perseverance. These are personal qualities which will remain of value throughout the cadets' lives and will undoubtedly assist when applying to university and in the early stages of their chosen careers.

Over the last few months, Miss Apenis, Mr Mangan, Miss Claydon and Miss Rigby have been in training so that KSA can launch its very own CCF. We have also recently appointed a SSI (School Staff Instructor), Mr Miller, who has more than 20 years of military experience to work specifically with our students and staff.

Twelve deserving Year 9 students have been selected to be our very first cadets this September, and once trained the CCF will be opened up to other year groups. This is a fantastic chance to take on leadership roles as students could have responsibility for a small group of cadets as a junior non-commissioned officer! Watch this space.

SPORTING SUCCESS

We have a range of sports on offer at KSA and last year proved to be a successful one for our budding athletes. To name but a few, our Year 7 and 9 girls' football team came third in the Slough School Sports Network tournament and five students were selected to represent Slough against the rest of Buckinghamshire in athletics.
