MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT

The Mathematics Department at JAGS has fourteen members of staff, each teaching at all key stages and ability. We are a supportive, approachable and collaborative department, who willingly share ideas and resources.

Five dedicated teaching rooms are equipped with interactive screens and large whiteboards for group problem solving. The Department is well-resourced with practical equipment whose use is integrated into schemes of work. A whole-class teaching approach predominates with the use of a core text, supplementary resources and activities; these include team and investigational tasks.

In Year 7 pupils are taught in their forms, but in Year 8 and 9 they are grouped into sets, according to ability. At KS3 we use Rayner's Essential Mathematics , supplemented by departmental-generated resources.

From Year 10 teaching is directed towards and beyond GCSE. A two-year course is followed with all students entered for Edexcel IGCSE Mathematics (A), Higher Tier. Very high standards are achieved, with 88% gaining levels 8 and 9 in 2019. Core texts are Edexcel IGCSE Mathematics A (Turner, Potts, Waite, Hony) and Mathematics for GCSE and IGCSE (CGP). About a quarter of Year 11 also take AQA Level 2 Certificate in Further Mathematics .

Mathematics is popular in the Sixth Form with around half the year group typiclaly studying the subject at A Level. The linear MEI OCR (B) course is followed with Core texts MEI A Level Mathematics (Porkess and Berry). Further Mathematics is also offered and many go on to read Mathematics or Science degrees at university.

The department shares a commitment to generating a positive attitude to Mathematics, instilling confidence, enjoyment and perseverance in our students. In lessons, applications of Mathematics are stressed and opportunities for pupils to explore ideas for themselves are sought. Many extra-curricular activities are provided including national competitions, a Hans Woyda Quiz team, UKMT maths teams, Year 7 enrichment clubs, Year 8 coding day, Mathematics Master Classes and KS4 and 5 conferences and lectures.

Drive, energy and enthusiasm are essential qualities in the Mathematics Department. Teaching at JAGS is rewarding and stimulating, and our teachers are well-qualified both academically and professionally, but they also possess a sense of humour and are prepared to enjoy themselves!

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
