WE ARE SCIENCE

At Norlington we offer a range of subjects for study at A-Level and B-Tec. Each of these courses are taught by skilled educators, dedicated to ensuring each pupil fulfils their potential.

This is most apparent in the study of the STEM subjects . At GCSE we have among the highest achieving pupils in London and beyond.

BIOLOGY

The study of life and living organisms, including their structure, function growth, evolution, distribution and taxonomy.

Entry requirement: Grade B and above in Core and Additional Science, Maths and English.

CHEMISTRY

The study of atoms and molecules and their interaction and transformation.

Entry requirement: Grade B and above in Core and Additional Science, Maths and English.

PHYSICS

The study of nature and properties of matter and energy.

Entry requirement: Grade B and above in Core and Additional Science, Maths and English.



SUBJECTS OFFERED - A LEVEL

COMPUTER SCIENCE

The study of computers and computational systems including theory, design and development.

Entry requirement: Grade B or above in Core and Additional Science, Maths and English.

ENGLISH LITERATURE

The study of literature and how it affected culture, context and history.

Entry requirement: GCSE grade B or above in English Literature.

ECONOMICS

The study of labour, land, investments, money, income, production, taxes and government expenses, among other topics.

Entry requirement: GCSE grade B or above in Maths and English.

FRENCH

The study of the French language both spoken and written.

Entry requirement: GCSE grade B or above in French.

GEOGRAPHY

The study of the Earth's landscapes, people, places and environment.

Entry requirement: GCSE grade B or above in Geography.

HISTORY

The study of historical individuals, societies, events and developments.

Entry requirement: GCSE grade B or above in History and English.

MATHS AND FURTHER MATHS

The study of topics such as quantity (numbers), structure, space and change.

Entry requirement: for Maths: Grade A in GCSE Maths or Additional Maths C/D.

Entry requirement: for Further Maths: GCSE Maths A/A* or Additional Maths Grade B or above.

PRODUCT DESIGN AND DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

The study of design, material, manufacturing and marketing.

Entry requirement: Grade B or above in DT subject or Art.



SUBJECTS OFFERED - BTEC

IT

A work-related qualification for the IT sector

Entry requirement: at least four GCSEs at grade C or above including Science, Maths and English and Grade B or above in ICT and AiDA.

BUSINESS STUDIES

A work-related qualification for the business sector

Entry requirement: GCSE grade C or above in Maths and English.

DRESS FOR SUCCESS

All students will be expected to dress in business attire with all boys wearing shirts, ties, trousers (not jeans or sports apparel) and shoes.

Girls are expected to wear a dark business suit.

Full details of dress code are detailed below.

Suit: Dark grey, dark blue or black

Shirt: plain coloured business shirt or white shirt. All shirts must be formal and collared. Any patterns must be discreet.

Tie: must be plain and sober (for boys)

Shoes: Black, formal shoes

APPEARANCE

Hair is expected to be tidy, natural and reasonable length - neither too long or inappropriately short or shaven.

Boys should not wear earrings or other piercing to school.

Girls' hair, make-up and nails should be tidy and natural looking. Jewellery should be discreet.



LESSONS AND ASSESSMENT

Our lessons are structured to help students maximise progress

Per week, each subject will be allocated two sessions, each lasting two hours, where students will focus on building knowledge and skills.

They will also have a further weekly one-hour tutorial where they will get personalised help understanding and developing theory.

BTEC subjects are allocated four two-hour sessions and a further tutorial.

Students will be regularly assessed during lessons and tutorials, as well as at assessment points every six weeks and with mock exams every 12 weeks to ensure they are ready to face the rigour of exam challenges.

Students will also be assessed through their active verbal participation in lessons and tutorials.

The teachers always go the extra mile for us. Not just for academic success but to help us develop into mature, practical and adaptable human beings.

THE SCHOOL DAY

All students are expected to be on site every day from 8:45am. When not in lessons, students will be expected to be studying in the LRC or 6th Form common room.

If a student does not have a tutorial session or 1:1 meeting after lunch and provided that they are on track to meet target grades, are up to date with work and have demonstrated the ability to work independently they will not be required to attend after session two.

A WORD FROM OUR HEAD OF 6TH FORM MR M. GEORGIADES


