# ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Founded by local Quakers in 1823 to educate their sons, Bootham is now a coeducational day and boarding school for students aged 3 – 19 in the centre of York. There are currently around 670 students at our junior and senior schools who, together with over 200 teaching and support staff, make up the Bootham Community.

The senior school is housed on Bootham, very close to the ancient city walls and Bootham Bar, a stone's throw from the Minster. Buildings range from elegant eighteenth and nineteenth century town houses along Bootham, to a stunning new Arts Centre opened in 2014. At the heart of the school – geographically and spiritually – is the award winning 'brutalist' 1960s meeting hall, where we meet for Quaker worship at least three times per week. Although a prime city centre site, the grounds are extensive and the overall impression created is one of space, calm and style; an oasis from the city outside.

The junior school is on a separate site nearby, having moved into purpose-built premises in 2002.

Approximately 90 students currently live in our three boarding houses, and comprise full, flexi and occasional boarders from at least 14 nationalities. While boarders are fully integrated into the daily pastoral structures of the school, the fact that we are a boarding school shapes the pace, structure and many of the priorities of the school's life. Boarding adds a richness and diversity to the community from which we all benefit.

Bootham is part of a community of nine Quaker schools in the United Kingdom and Ireland and many more worldwide. The schools in the British Isles collaborate together closely in a number of ways.



# BOOTHAM AIMS AND VALUES

In pursuing our vision and in seeking to promote the purpose of a Bootham Education we set ourselves the following aims:

- To continue to grow and further develop a thriving community that reflects Quaker principles and practices, helping each individual to grow to recognise and develop 'that of God' in themselves and in other people
- To help all students to become the best person that each can be and to achieve the best of which each is capable ·
- To promote habits of hard work, self-regulating and the meeting of high standards of personal conduct in all aspects of work and relationships. We aim to develop our students into genuinely good people who are reflective, who seek truth and light, and whose lives speak with integrity of positive, pro-social values ·
- To promote kindness, a questioning spirit, humility, and a deep sense of social responsibility, as well as both the courage and confidence to speak up, and to work to build a better world
- As staff and Governors, to model to our young people the qualities and values that we aspire for them to hold, and to do so with patience but in the expectation of high standards, seeking for – and helping them to seek for – 'that of God' within them
- As an employer, to provide a stimulating, fair and supportive working environment in which all employees understand the role they play in building a better world and know that they are valued for playing it

At Bootham School we value particularly an approach to our community from all who work and learn here which:

- looks for, responds to and works hard to draw out 'that of God' in others and in themselves
- seeks to make a positive contribution to the Bootham community and shows respect for its Quaker values, practices and heritage
- speaks with integrity of a straightforward, kind, caring and unquestioningly respectful approach to others
- is wholehearted, demonstrating commitment both to being the best that they can be and to the hard work needed in rising to the challenge of high standards and high expectations
- speaks truth, placing honesty in all things as a priority and is able to resolve conflict peacefully
- is ambitious to improve the world for others – near and far – in whatever ways they can.



# DUTIES AND EXPECTATIONS OF A GOVERNOR

- Set a clear vision and strategic plan for the school and ensure the necessary structures are in place to deliver those as part of the strategic management of the school
- Ensure that the fundamental values and guiding principles of the School are articulated, reflected and understood throughout the School
- Agree the method for measuring objectively the progress of the School in relation to its strategic plan
- Ensure that the school complies with all legal and statutory requirements
- Ensure robust and assured procedures, training and proper oversight are in place to ensure that everyone who comes into contact with the School is safe, in particular pupils, employees, staff, contractors and volunteers
- Act as guardians of the School's assets, both tangible and intangible, taking all due care over their security, deployment and proper application
- Appoint the Head, set their terms and conditions and ensure that, as with all staff, the Head receives regular, constructive feedback on their professional performance

A full Governors' Meeting is held once a term and Governors are also expected to sit on at least one other sub-Committee which meet once a term (Finance and Resources, Governance and Compliance, Education, Health and Safety and Pastoral, Boarding and Safeguarding, Marketing and Fundraising). Governors must be prepared to attend as many meetings and school events as possible.

Governors must be prepared to commit sufficient time to visit the school and to study background papers for meetings. E-learning courses will need to be completed alongside regular safeguarding update training.



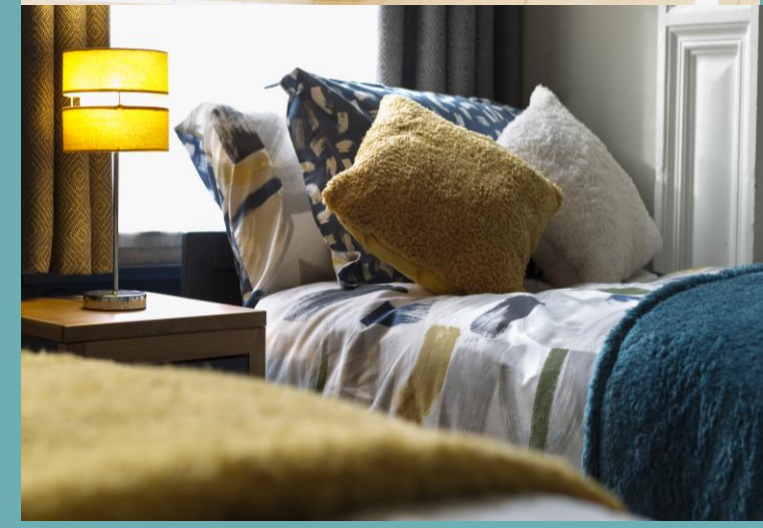
# PERSONAL SPECIFICATION

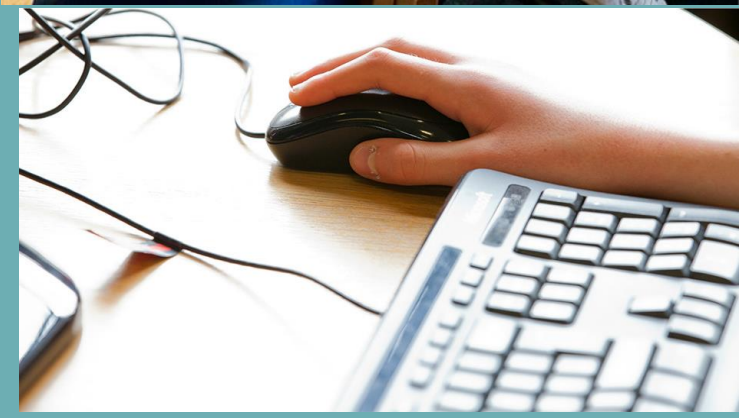
