Job Purpose:	<p>To work as part of a dedicated Construction team, providing high-quality technical support to staff and students engaged in practical learning activities.</p> <p>The role involves preparing, maintaining, and supervising workshop environments; supporting the delivery of practical sessions; maintaining equipment and consumables; and contributing to the continuous development of resources and facilities in collaboration with the Senior Technician and wider team.</p>
Main Duties & Responsibilities:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide technical support to Lecturers and students during practical sessions, ensuring that safe working practices are consistently followed. 2. Support Lecturers in the delivery of regular workshop-based teaching sessions and assessments and, on occasion, provide cover when required 3. Manage and maintain workshops and teaching spaces, ensuring all tools, machinery, and equipment are safe, functional, and fit for purpose; liaise with external maintenance contractors where required. 4. Work closely with teaching staff to schedule practical activities, allowing sufficient time for preparation, setup, and post-session clear-down.

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	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Prepare equipment, materials, tools, and instructional resources for planned practical activities. 6. Maintain accurate stock control and inventory systems, including auditing resources and ensuring adequate levels of consumable materials. 7. Order materials and equipment in line with college processes. Keep accurate records of deliveries and stock within the department. 8. Ensure workshop security, cleanliness and Health & Safety is always maintained in the workshop and department. 9. Diagnose faults and carry out repairs on practical equipment where appropriate. 10. Maintain tools and equipment, including arranging servicing, inspections, and repairs. 11. Actively contribute to wider departmental projects and initiatives. 12. Demonstrate the safe and effective use of key equipment to students, visitors, and new or developing staff as part of inductions and training. 13. Participate fully in College/University activities, including attendance at meetings, boards, committees, recruitment events, admissions processes, and student interviews as required. 14. Take part in and deliver relevant training to support the ongoing development of the University. 15. Attend meetings, training sessions, and events that contribute to programme development, providing feedback to the teaching team and Senior Technician
