General

Core Purpose

Stamford Easter Revision Courses will be open to pupils in years 11 and 13 studying at any school, who are about to sit GCSE or A Level exams. The Easter Revision Courses Course Tutors will be required to plan and deliver revision courses designed to improve the knowledge and understanding of students, in order to boost confidence and motivate them. You will assist them with study and revision techniques to help them organise their time and to prepare them for their upcoming exams. A flexible approach is needed so that you are quickly able to adapt to the different needs of the students in your group. You will be teaching a maximum of 10 students per class.

Key Areas of Responsibility

- 1. Plan, prepare and deliver the course, including provision of any required resources.
- 2. Deliver motivating, varied and engaging sessions to the students
- 3. Provide feedback to students throughout the course.
- 4. Provide a short meaningful written report and course summary, at the end of the course, on individual progress, particularly the approach and endeavour of the students.
