A willingness to offer support to other aspects of the extra-curricular life of the school, including boarding, is assumed.



THE DEPARTMENT 9

There is a strong focus on the development of students' independent learning skills throughout the department, and students rise to the high expectations and challenges set.

Psychology is currently taught by an experienced team of four specialist teachers. It is a particularly enthusiastic department who greatly enjoy participating in the continual study and development of the subject. There is a strong focus on the development of students' independent learning skills throughout the department, and students rise to the high expectations and challenges set. This approach produces enthusiastic, inquisitive learners alongside pleasing examination results and very healthy numbers at A level.

In Year 12 and Year 13 students follow the AQA A Level Psychology course (7182). This linear course is a balance of theory and contemporary psychology in action and includes study of different psychological theories, research findings, case studies and the different methods used to collect data. It is expected that teaching will include practical investigation, key research, as well as written and oral evaluation of students' progress.

The department organises relevant trips, helpful to student development, and students in the department also publish their own Psychology magazine 'PsychoSES'.

The joint Sixth Form teaching arrangements mean that both boys and girls are taught at the High School for Psychology. There are usually four sets in Year 12 and also four Y13 sets.

Teaching takes place in three dedicated classrooms. These classrooms are equipped with networked electronic whiteboards. The department has

a well-resourced office including an extensive collection of academic books, magazines and DVDs which are used to support teaching.

There is also access to excellent internet based resources including JSTOR, home to hundreds of specialist periodicals, which A Level students use to support their studies.

Stamford Endowed Schools have a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) strategy and tablet technology is used in the classroom. From September 2017 this will be operational for pupils in Y8, Y9 and Y10.

Teachers must have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school in which they teach.

ROUNDED AND GROUNDED

Established in 1877, Stamford High School has been educating girls for 140 years and has moved from a stereotypical "girls school" to a modern educational establishment providing opportunities for girls to grow academically whilst acquiring and developing the skills necessary to go into the world with confidence. At the beginning of the 21st century, it came together with the boys' school, Stamford School, and Stamford Junior School, to form a "diamond structure" as the Stamford Endowed Schools (SES).

The individual schools, whilst in many respects autonomous, see themselves as part of a much bigger organisation which allows for the sharing of expertise, resources and facilities and provide families with "one School" for their children, regardless of age or gender. The School remains true to its founding principles of single sex education; girls and boys remain in their individual senior schools from ages 11 to 18 but the Sixth Form is co-educational with students attending lessons at both school sites. In addition, many extracurricular activities such as

Music, Drama, CCF and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award are co-educational and it is envisaged that this type of collaboration will continue to increase.

The present Head, Vicky Buckman, has been in post for 18 months and is passionate about the outcomes for young people. An advocate of the research and ideas of Carol Dweck and "growth mindset", students are encouraged to believe that "anything is possible" if they work hard and take advantage of all the opportunities offered. The staff are committed and hard-working and expectations are high; the School prides itself on producing well-rounded, resilient, down-to-earth young people; ready to take on the world. The Schools have a bursarial fund and a number of students are in receipt of bursaries or scholarships; this means the Schools are both inclusive and socially diverse.

The School has a small, but growing, boarding community (about 10% of the girls board as either weekly or full boarders) and an interest in, and enthusiasm for, the role of boarding in education is desirable.

PASTORAL CARE

Children of families from all walks of life have the opportunity to gain a place at our Schools and the surrounding community enjoys and benefits from the presence, activities and facilities of the Schools

Our pastoral programme is given the highest priority, as we know that happy, cared-for children are most likely to thrive. There are many structures in place to ensure that the welfare of every child at our School is safeguarded and that their progress is monitored carefully. Form Tutors develop good relationships with each member of their set and are quickly able to identify problems. The house system mixes girls across the School, providing the younger girls with good role models and creating within the older girls a sense of responsibility. Student mentors support the younger girls and are willing to discuss any issues they might have.
