The Sunday Caretaker is responsible for providing Sunday cover for lettings and caretaking, including setting up for lettings, giving access to staff and contractors, meeting and directing visitors, challenging trespassers and receiving and logging deliveries.

The Sunday cover will also need to carry out some simple maintenance duties whilst providing cover.

Responsibilities

Access:

- Open and lock up spaces for hirers, staff, and contractors
- Be on call with the Estates mobile for anyone coming in
- Manage parking in the drive
- Relock and alarm buildings at the end of the day
- Ensure only authorised personnel are on site, and asking unauthorised to leave (this may include students)


Lettings:

- Ensure hired spaces are checked and set up in good time
- If a space is used by more than one party, ensure that the spaces are cleared down and set up ready for the next event
- Supply bags for recycling and waste to the hired spaces
- Leave the Compliance and Lettings Officer any special instructions for Monday, e.g., requirement for additional works from our contract cleaners
- Support the regular clubs taking place in school regular sports club meetings and parties at the school

Caretaking:

- Assist and provide access to contractors carrying out repairs and maintenance
- Carry our statutory checks as directed, for example emergency lighting checks, boundary and play checks
- Ensure hired spaces are put back to normal layout at the end of the day
- Disinfect sandpits
- Litter picking and sweeping
- Emptying external bins
- Topping up external hand sanitiser points
- Breaking down meeting set-ups and returning utensils, refreshments to kitchen







 Where possible, be available to cover leave or other absences for the Saturday caretaker

Person specification

- Successful experience of providing caretaking services in a similar environment
- Personable and welcoming with good oral communication skills, including the ability to receive, record and transmit messages accurately and quickly
- Experience of building good working relationships with members of staff and contractors
- Ability to work on own initiative and without direct supervision
- An understanding of health and safety issues appropriate to the responsibilities of the post
