#### **Key Purpose of the Role**

The Sports Coach will support the daily coaching and teaching of Physical Education and Girls' Games from Nursery (age 3+) to Prep 6 during term time.

For those available all year-round, the Sports Coach would deliver a high-quality multi-sports provision for the School's holiday club.

#### **Key Responsibilities**

#### **Teaching & Coaching:**

- Deliver high-quality Physical Education and Girls' Games lessons, ensuring engaging, inclusive and progressive learning experiences.
- Assist the Head of Girls' Games with the co-ordination of the girls' games programme, including extra-curricular activities.
- Coach and teach across a range of age groups, including EYFS, infant, and junior pupils (ages 3-11).
- Support PE teachers in lessons, working with small groups to support inclusive learning, as well
  as developing talented individuals.
- Provide high-quality school sport opportunities beyond curriculum time to enhance pupils' skills and engagement.

#### **Fixtures & Competitions:**

- As part of the role, you will be required to primarily attend girls' fixtures and coach teams as needed, including occasional Saturdays mornings to support Cross Country and weekend sporting residentials.
- Organise and/or assist in the delivery of school girls fixtures and competitions.
- Act as a coach and offer support before, during, and after events.
- Attend sporting residentials trips linked to Girls' Games and act as coach, offering guidance and support.
- Drive the school mini-bus to fixtures and events, when required. Full training provided.

#### Pupil Development & Feedback:

- Provide feedback to pupils and PE staff on progress and team selection.
- Monitor and report on specific pupil groups as required.

#### Resource & Safety Management:

- Assist with the daily running of sporting activities and manage related equipment for the main school, and the holiday club for those available all year-round.
- Ensure all sports equipment and facilities are checked for safety before use for main school, and holiday club for those available all year-round.
- Maintain and develop resources, ensuring they align with the school's Physical Education and Games policies.
- Liaise with the Director of Sport regarding priorities and efficient use of resources.

#### **Health & Safety & School Duties:**

- Adhere to risk assessments and health and safety guidelines.
- Carry out additional school duties as reasonably requested (e.g., playground supervision).
- Conduct yourself professionally and uphold the school's safeguarding policies.

#### **Professional Development**

- Engage in the school's Professional Review procedures to enhance teaching and coaching practices.
- Stay up to date with the latest coaching developments and rule changes in relevant sports.
- Attend INSET training, including four full INSET days per year.

## **Additional Responsibilities**

- Support pupils' overall well-being, providing guidance on educational and social matters.
- Communicate with parents, colleagues, and external bodies as required.
- Participate in staff meetings, INSET days, and co-curricular activities.
- Accompany pupils on school trips, including residential trips.
- Maintain learning spaces, display pupil work, and contribute to a positive school environment.
- Attend Open Mornings and key school events as required.

This role offers an exciting opportunity to inspire young learners, develop their sporting skills, and contribute to a thriving sports program both during the school day, and during the school holiday periods for those candidates available all year-round.

## THE SCHOOL

Lady Barn House School is a thriving independent day preparatory school for boys and girls aged 3 to 11. There are currently around 480 pupils on roll. The school offers excellent teaching, traditional values and exceptional pastoral care. There is a strong academic legacy with an individual focus on strengthening each pupil's confidence and abilities. The school aims to ensure that each child is happy, challenged and empowered to take full advantage of the wealth of opportunities on offer at Lady Barn House School; leaving them equipped with the knowledge, skills and confidence to make a successful transition to Senior School.

The School has its own site on Schools Hill, Cheadle, enjoying its own superior facilities, including specialist classrooms, a fully equipped EYFS unit with exceptional indoor and outdoor facilities, a separate performing arts building, an extensive Woodland School area, indoor gymnasium and two large floodlit astro-turfs. The aspirations of children and parents are high and we are constantly striving to maintain and further improve our standards.

## **DETAILS OF THE POST**

We are looking to appoint a suitably qualified sports coach to join our PE team on a permanent basis. We offer flexibility for this role, with the option to work during term time only or all year round.

During term time, the core hours are 33.25 hours per week are 10am to 5.15pm Monday to Thursday and 10am to 4.45pm on Friday, plus 6 days (4 INSET days plus 2 additional days to support residential and other sporting events).

For those available year-round, the candidate would provide a multi-sports provision for the School's holiday club during school holidays, working from 9am to 4.15pm Monday to Friday.

As the successful candidate will primarily be required to teach girls' games during term time, only female candidates will be considered suitable for this position. This is a genuine occupational requirement (as defined by the Equality Act 2010).

This is a rare opportunity to play a role in the ongoing development of the school's sport provision at Lady Barn House School. The main aspects of the role include;

- Coaching our pupils in sport alongside the Director of Sport, Head of Girls' Games and the PE Teacher.
- Assist the Head of Girls' Games in the coordination and delivery of the Girls' Games teaching programme.
- Assist with sporting activities and fixtures during and after school, and occasionally on weekends.

Coaching Physical Education lessons to pupils aged between 3 and 11 (either alongside another member of the PE teaching staff or the class Teaching Assistant). There may be occasions where the Sports Coach will take classes/groups on an individual basis, however, support in the planning of these lessons will be given prior and evaluations will take place for their professional development.

## **CONDITIONS OF SERVICE**

During term time, the hours of work are 33.25 hours per week. The successful candidate will work from 10am to 5.15pm Monday to Thursday and 10am to 4.45pm on Fridays, during term time.

For those candidates available to work all year round, working hours during school holiday periods will be 9am to 4.15pm. Working hours include a 30-minute unpaid lunch break.

Lady Barn House School has its own salary scale. The Salary for this role is Scale E, Points 17-20, £26,375 to £27,812 per annum (pro rata for part-time).
