St Winifred's Primary School has been educating and developing children in Lee, Lewisham since 1892. It is a voluntary aided school, and part of the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes in the Catholic Diocese of Southwark. Our school:

- Is two-form entry with 419 children and 70 staff.
- Is financially well-managed with a budgetary surfeit.
- Has attractive, well-equipped grounds following the 2017 redevelopment of the site to co-locate the nursery, infant and junior schools. Includes two halls, new ICT suite, multi-use games area (MUGA) and landscaped grounds.
- Achieves strong academic performance, significantly exceeding national and local attainment levels.

#### What the staff say

- We respect and live the Gospel values.
- Our school is child-centred; nurturing the mental well-being and creative and academic potential of each child.
- We have a rich and creative curriculum.
- We have high expectations of children's behaviour, attainment and progress.
- We work in an inclusive, encouraging and supportive way, where all staff are valued and respected for their contributions.
- We have a strong community ethos and inclusive partnerships.

#### HOW WE ARE DOING

- Strong academic performance, exceeding national and borough-wide levels achieving:
  Good Level of Development; expected standards in Reading, Writing, Maths, combined RWM and English; and high level of attainment for Reading, Writing and Writing and English.
- Centre of excellence for supporting children with Special Educational Needs.
- Lower than the local average for underweight, overweight and obesity at both Reception and Year Six.
- Supportive infrastructure including an active PTA and professional support from a strong Senior Leadership Team, Southwark Diocese, Catholic Head Teachers Network and the Council-supported *Lewisham Learning* partnership of local school leaders.
- Rated 'Good' by Ofsted across Overall effectiveness and individual categories in October 2018, observing "most pupils making strong progress" and "an overwhelming majority of parents and carers say[ing] the school is well led and managed and would recommend it to others."

## HOW WE ARE IMPROVING (SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2020/21)

In the academic year 2020/21 we are focussing on five key areas:

- 1. Instilling a sense of environmental stewardship of the planet in all pupils through a culture of respect, care and kindness, and the carbon reduction 'retro fit' programme.
- 2. Developing the curriculum through:
- A 'whole school' approach to discrimination.
- Addressing gaps from the COVID-19 lockdown developing a blended learning approach.
- Improving maths outcomes particularly at higher standard through whole school mastery approach; and
- Strengthening reading outcomes and teaching in Key Stage 2 through Destination Reader project.
- 3. Supporting pupil and staff wellbeing through:
- Developing the community space as a 'wellbeing hub', including opportunities for outdoor activities and meetings; and
- Creating safe spaces for pupils to work with the counsellor, staff, and external agencies.
- 4. Strengthening Early Years Foundation Stage to ensure each child maximises language skills, through high quality teaching and early intervention.
- 5. Developing leadership through recruitment and effective induction of a new headteacher.
