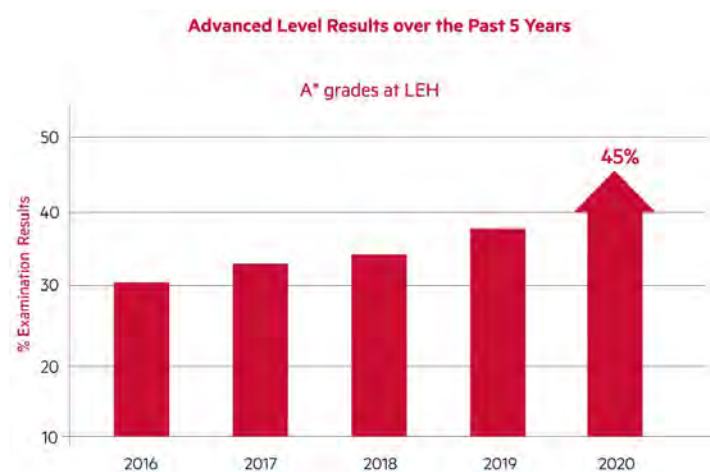

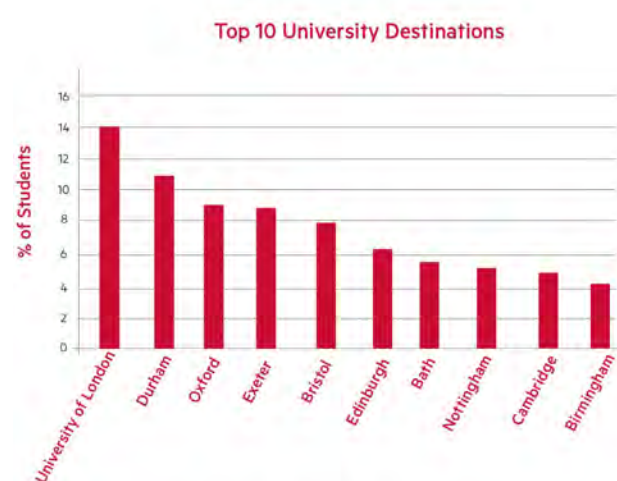
Academic Matters

Happiness and Wellbeing

The happiness and wellbeing of all members of the School community is a priority. For students this means that staff show a genuine interest in their health, happiness and well-being. The pastoral programme is designed to provide students with the skills they need to navigate life and to make good decisions based upon understanding and access to reliable information. The House structure ensures that all students have the opportunity to participate and to lead while providing a smaller community where each student is known and valued. All staff are involved in the pastoral care of students as tutors, through Boarding House duties, extra-curricular activities and through the delivery of the Learning for Life programme.

State-of-the-art facilities ensure that student learning is enriched through a wide-ranging programme of extra-curricular activities. While sport, music and drama form the backbone of the programme there is opportunity for staff to share their own passions, whatever they might be. All staff are fully involved in the extra-curricular programme which provides a rich diversity of activities and events in which to participate.

Pastoral care for staff is as important as it is for students. The School actively seeks to build a warm and friendly community for all employees and there are opportunities to meet and socialise with the Senior Leadership Team and colleagues in an informal setting. The staff social committee also organises a range of social events and trips as well as ensuring that all staff enjoy support they would normally receive from friends and family at home. Ongoing support is also available to smooth the practicalities of everyday life such as setting up and dealing with bank accounts, setting up wechat pay accounts and medical assistance. Staff are able to use School facilities at off-peak times and also have access to a private, well-equipped gym/fitness suite in the staff accommodation block.

Living in a foreign country can be daunting at first so a pre-arrival handbook for new staff tells you more about day-to-day life at the School and in Foshan, practical tips such as what things you may want to bring with you and what activities are available locally. Once new staff arrive, a detailed induction and orientation programme is in place to help you settle in and develop camaraderie with your new colleagues, all with the sense of the joyful LEH spirit.

A JOYFUL AND HEALTHY COMMUNITY





LEH Foshan has been jointly designed by the Guangdong Architecture and Design Research Institute and Scott Brownrigg as a green campus with detailed thought paid to the quality of the environment as well as the carbon footprint of the School.

The main teaching block features wide, naturally lit corridors, classrooms designed for collaborative learning and large department bases and meeting rooms. Specialist rooms for Science and Technology, Art, Drama, Music and Sport have all been designed to be flexible and provide state-of-the-art facilities.

STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITIES DESIGNED FOR COLLABORATIVE LEARNING



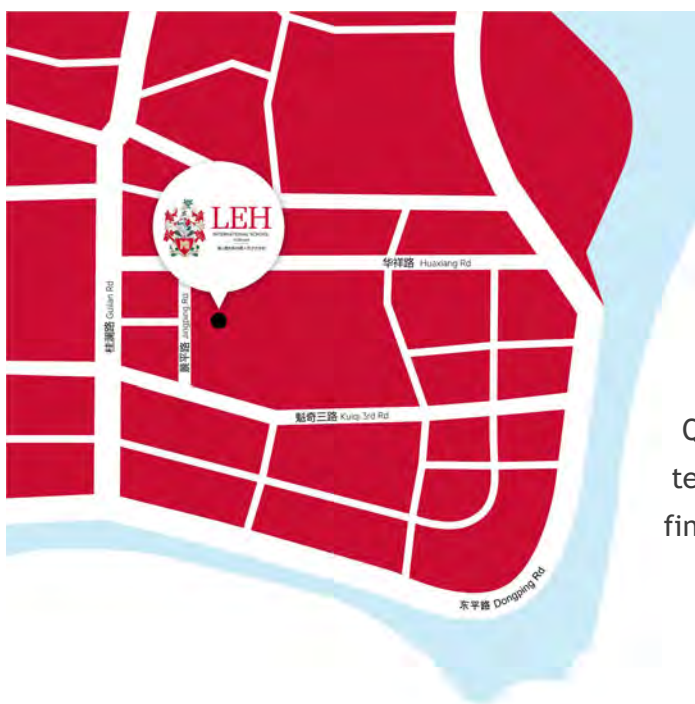
The campus is linked to high-speed, 5G wi-fi and all staff and students have their own laptops which seamlessly link with the smart screens provided in every class and meeting room. Special group rooms allow staff and students to collaborate with each other and with students in other schools through webcasts and online meetings.

On-campus accommodation is provided for all teaching staff who are encouraged to participate in community life. In addition to access to the school facilities, the purpose-built staff accommodation includes a fitness centre and large, flexible social spaces including a terrace overlooking the 400m running track and sports fields.



The Location

Foshan is a second tier city of around 9 million people at the heart of the Greater Bay Area of southern China formed by Hong-Kong, Guangdong Province and Macau. It is an historical city with a rich Buddhist culture and is known as the home of the Chinese porcelain industry, the style of Chinese martial art Wing Chun known as Kung Fu and Chinese Opera.



LEH Foshan is in the Chancheng district of Foshan, 70 minutes from the International Airport in Guangzhou and just under an hour from Hong Kong/Hong Kong International Airport by highspeed train.

The Chancheng government are redeveloping the Qicha sub-district into a green and smart, high technology hub with a new science and medical park, finance centres and centres of education.

The area surrounding LEH Foshan is green and air quality is good. There are plenty of cycling and running tracks along the banks of the Dongping Waterway and adjacent to the Ban Yuedao wetland park. Traditional culture has been preserved in nearby Lingnan Tiandi, which has been redeveloped as a pedestrianised restaurant and shopping area.
