We share a rich history, tracing our roots back to the 17th Century when our founder, Robert Aske, established the principles that guide us to this day - we give talented and ambitious young people, irrespective of background, the opportunities they need to succeed in life.

Our priority is the education of the whole person in a truly exceptional learning environment with outstanding facilities. Our inquisitive students are taught by highly qualified, committed staff who, in partnership with parents, provide every student with the intellectual, cultural, physical, moral, personal and spiritual resources they need to give them confidence to go forward in a changing world.

Train to Teach at Habs

Our three-year programme provides high quality, salaried training leading to a qualification recognised across both the independent and maintained sectors. The programme includes in-school, immersive, and supportive experience for individuals who are aspirational, passionate about their subject and who would like

to explore teaching as a profession and career path.

Whether your aim is to teach in an independent or maintained school, the Habs Schools' training programme provides an outstanding start.

The three-year course is enjoyable, stimulating and challenging and, once you have achieved your QTS, you will be ideally placed to rapidly progress your career either within the classroom setting or into positions of responsibility. The Schools' graduate teacher programme is open to both graduates who are currently employed as teachers but who do not have QTS and to graduates who have no teaching experience, but looking to start their career in teaching.

So long as you have a suitable degree, a passion for your subject and a wish to impart your enthusiasm to others, you can be considered for a place.



Year 1

You will follow the Teaching Apprenticeship route to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) with e-Qualitas, in addition to gaining a PGCE with the University of Buckingham. You will be based at either the Boys or Girls schools over the 12-month period, with an opportunity to teach at both schools during the year, in addition to spending 6 weeks in a contrasting-maintained school to further broaden your experience. Opportunities to teach at our Prep/Junior Schools will may also be available.

This is a supernumerary post with a reduced timetable and protected time for regular mentoring and lesson observation, as well as being part of many different teams from which you will receive guidance and advice in the aspects of a school; academic, pastoral, co-curricular. Our INSET courses and in-house bespoke training will continue to build your knowledge and confidence, as will working closely with colleagues in your own subject area to develop subject-specific knowledge and pedagogy. This in-house training and support run alongside the training and guidance provided by e-Qualitas. You will be given 20% 'off the job' training time which involves; directed tasks, training days, weekly reflective activities, reading and assignments building up a portfolio of evidence to show that the Teachers' Standards are being met.


Your allocated school mentor will observe you teach and meet with you weekly, as well as an allocated e-Qualitas tutor who will visit you 5 times over the year. Your training will be focused on the Dfe Teaching Standards and you will learn how to plan so that all pupils make good progress in lessons over time. You will have multiple opportunities to rehearse and refine different approaches to teaching that prepares you for the reality of the classroom. You will be assessed for QTS against the apprenticeship teacher standards, within the 12-month apprenticeship programme, at which point QTS is awarded.

Year 2 to 3

After QTS has been awarded you will become a Newly Qualified Teacher (NQT). If you show the appropriate commitment and potential the Schools' will support, you through your two-year induction. You will continue to have a reduced timetable, in Year 2 a 10% remission and in Year 3, 5%. You will be supported by an Induction Mentor and Tutor who will guide you through the two-year Induction programme underpinned by the Early Career Framework. You must meet all the DfE Teaching Standards by the end of the process to pass induction which is overseen by the Independent Schools' Teacher Induction Panel (IStip). At the end of Year 3 workforce planning should allow for a permanent role to be offered or support will be given to secure a role in another leading school.

To be eligible to join the Schools' Train to Teach programme you will need all the following:





The right to work in the UK which will be valid for at least three years.



FAQS

1. Do I need to complete the skills tests in literacy and numeracy prior to applying?

No, the tests will be taken prior to starting Year 1.

Do I need any school/educational experience prior to applying?

No, though you will be interested in developing a career that offers great benefits and opportunities for you to use a wide range of skills and inspire students in the subject you love. And, if you are considering changing your career, you will have many transferable skills beneficial to your role as a teacher.

3. What in-school support/mentoring/coaching will there be?

You will be supported by a subject mentor and a school mentor, as well as having opportunities to collaborate with a range of colleagues both within your subject and across the school. Advice and support will be on hand from colleagues who are at different stages in their teaching careers. Your mentor will support you in every aspect of teaching: initially, you will shadow your mentor, and other colleagues, for a period of time to grow in confidence and begin to develop as a teacher. Regular mentoring sessions will give you a clear understanding of the academic and pastoral systems within the school.

4. What internal training on teaching and learning theory will be provided?

You will be supported by our in-house 'New to Teaching' training and school Professional Development programmes, alongside the Apprenticeship eQ training. Specific training in lesson planning, assessment and differentiation will encourage you to teach to the strengths and needs of all your pupils.

5. At the end of the three-year programme, is there a permanent job available?

We are very proud of the development opportunities we offer at Habs, both internally and externally. At the end of your three years we will work with you to secure a permanent role within one of the Schools. If a role is not available internally, we are confident that with the skills and qualifications you will have gained whilst with us, your opportunities will be broad.

6. What is the salary on starting and what is my earning potential?

The starting salary on joining is £28,415 (as at September 2020), and upon joining you will have access to the Teachers' Pensions Scheme. We pride ourselves on rewarding our staff for the contributions they make to the School and offer our own attractive Teachers' pay scale well above the national scales. Progression through the scales is dependent on overall contribution and performance.
