This position is equally suitable for an experienced teacher and one new to the profession.

The Art results are very strong both at GCSE (86% achieving grade 4 or better in 2019) and at A' level (83% A*-C in 2019). The Creative Design Faculty is proud of the success of their students at both GCSE and A level, and increasingly students are studying these or related subjects at University. The successful candidate would be expected to teach Art at KS3, KS4 and A' Level.
