You will oversee both Primary and Secondary Sports provision, providing guidance and leadership to all colleagues who teach Sport. A keen outdoor and adventure sports enthusiast, your passion for the benefits of outdoor learning and sport will inspire and motivate students and colleagues.

Teaching and Learning

Curriculum Development

- Plan, implement, deliver and refine an Outdoor Education programme with opportunities for adventure learning, including options for developing Beach and Forest school within our K12 curriculum
- Advise the Principal and Senior Leadership Team on the introduction, phasing and ongoing development of the programme
- Prepare competitive costs and detailed budgets and action plans for initial set up and ongoing delivery of school Sport and Outdoor Education
- Lead overnight or other residential expeditions and trips, completing all necessary planning and administration with meticulous attention to detail
- Coordinate the Duke of Edinburgh scheme
- Ensure that all activities are compliant with local and international best practice and Health and Safety guidelines
- Complete dynamic and on the spot risk assessments as routine part of planning and activity execution Liaise with third party providers and regulatory bodies to ensure best quality, accountability, safety and security in all activities undertaken by students
- Commit to ongoing professional development to stay abreast of industry developments and ensure up to date skills and qualifications e.g. as Mountain Leader or Wilderness First Aider
- Organise, attend and where possible, host competitive fixtures for school teams, recognising that these will often include evening or weekend events
- Lead after schools sports practices and squads
- Build links within the local school, sporting and wider Globeducate network to ensure access to a broad range of events and opportunities for Southlands students
- Be a positive role model and ambassador for Sports and Outdoor Education, embodying a "can do" attitude, resilience and kindness in all that you do
- Understand the varying needs and abilities of students, supporting, challenging and encouraging each student to do their best

- Establish a purposeful and safe learning environment for all children
- Promote the general progress and well-being of individual children and of the class as a whole
- Contribute to the preparation of action plans and other support mechanisms

- Contribute to Key stage events such as productions and assemblies
