The Hive at Co-op Academy Walkden

The Hive is an Enhanced Resource Provision for students with Moderate Learning Difficulties. We play a vital role in Salford's vision for developing provision for students with SEND and improving options and outcomes for all students. We have 7 students each year group who are referred to us through Salford's SEND team. These students require specialist support which may not normally be available in other mainstream Schools. The Hive plays a significant role in extending inclusion of Salford students with SEN in mainstream Schools.

In most cases, students will benefit from a combination of access to teaching in small groups in the Hive, and time in mainstream classes, with additional support. There is a higher than usual level of staffing to meet more complex needs, which extends to break and lunch time support. Whilst students will be able to access much of the national curriculum, differentiated to an appropriate level, they will also benefit from an enriched curriculum including:

- Structured literacy/numeracy programmes
- The development of independent work skills
- The development of Social skills
- The development of Life skills
- The use of Community visits
- Access to appropriate alternative qualifications.

The Hive itself is situated within main Academy, but with separate entrance and facilities, enabling students to develop ownership and have a secure haven.

We are part of the Discovery Zone [also inc. ICT, Business Studies and Computing which is one of the largest at WHS. The Science department is made up of a close team of 16 staff. We have 6 fully equipped labs and a designated ICT facility.



Teaching

- To use regular, thorough and accurate assessment to plan and prepare well informed, focused and engaging lessons which consistently cater for the full ability range of each class, provide feedback as to how to improve and ensure that all students make at least good progress.
- To use the Co-op Academy Walkden Assessment for Learning Handbook to undertake assessment of students as required by external examination body, school and zone policies.
- To use data to monitor and evidence student progress, providing assessment data/reports on the progress of individual students and groups of students taught as required.
- To use excellent subject knowledge to teach across the age and ability range within your zone.
- To plan and deliver well informed and engaging lessons, according to the Co-op Academy Walkden Teaching for Learning Handbook.
