<b>JOB TITLE</b>	Music Peripatetic Teacher – Upper Strings

<b>JOB PURPOSE</b>	To provide, in conjunction with other members of the music department, sound instruction on the principle instrument at as high a level as possible, giving the student a firm basis to communicate music at an early stage.

### KEY TASKS

- To encourage regular and intelligent practice by setting tasks for practice between the lessons
- Advise students on instrumental examinations where appropriate
- Encourage students to participate in ensembles and to assist in the administration of, arrangement for, and coaching of these ensembles where appropriate
- Support the GCSE and A Level practical papers
- Advise on maintenance of the instruments stock
- Advise students who wish to purchase an instrument of their own
- Create rota timetables for the students where possible
- Monitor students' attendance, practice and progress
