- Use methods and resources, such as ICT effectively
- Facilitate increasingly independent learning
- Enthuse and extend learners, including those with additional learning needs
- Analyse data, monitor attainment of all students within each class, ensure that targets are set, progress is reviewed and action taken to eliminate underachievement
- Expect, encourage and support students to achieve consistently high standards
- Manage the behaviour of students effectively
- Monitor the attendance of students in lessons, intervening where it is not good
- Identify, recognise, praise and reward students systematically for good work, good behaviour and good progress
- Contribute to raising the achievement of specific target groups within classes
- Ensure that gifted students are identified and that excellence is promoted and celebrated
- Contact parents when there are concerns about the progress or welfare of students and when they have done particularly well
- Pursue opportunities for students to engage with the wider community through (the subject) and to portray a positive image of the Academy to the Community
- Utilise support staff allocated to groups or individuals effectively
- Take responsibility for your own professional learning
- Contribute to preparing and reviewing high quality schemes of work
- Apply school policies consistently and where necessary, firmly, particularly those relating to teaching and learning, assessment, behaviour, homework and attendance
- Demonstrate a commitment to Out of Hours Learning and enrichment activities
- Help to ensure that all faculty resources are well maintained and managed
- Attend relevant meetings, seminars and conferences
- Teach up to 22 periods per week
- Be responsible for a tutor group
