- maintain good order and discipline amongst pupils, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy;
- participate in meetings which relate to the school's management, curriculum, administration or organisation;





- communicate and co-operate with specialists from outside agencies;
- lead, organise and direct support staff within the classroom;
- produce musical/performing arts/performance events at group/class and whole school level
- assist in forming a Key Stage 2 choir
- undertake all reasonable duties when requested by the Head of Arts and the Senior Leadership Team:
- be responsible for the delivery, progress and attainment in the subject as mapped with the Head of Arts,
- undertake the normal pastoral duties as a form tutor or house tutor,
