Previous experience of working with or interacting with children or young people is required for this role as well as good communication skills, an ability to work with minimum of supervision and to manage students in a classroom setting. Confidence using a laptop as well as good organisational skills are important for this role.

In addition, if you are a graduate with an interest in a career working with young people in education and you would like this opportunity to gain some experience working in a classroom environment before considering teacher training, we would be delighted to receive your application. We are a highly inclusive, comprehensive and local school with virtually all students living within walking or cycling distance. As the largest school in Maidenhead we are able to offer our students a wealth of options within and beyond the classroom. Similarly, our staff have a wide range of CPD and promotion opportunities.

We are keen to encourage every child to ACHIEVE *their* excellence whether that be a highly academic place at Oxbridge, a more vocational route or one of the many other pathways open to them. By offering opportunities throughout their school careers, we ensure students are not just well-qualified but mature young adults who we are proud to know.

Furze Platt Senior School was rated 'Good' by Ofsted in our most recent inspection (November 2021). We have nearly 180 caring, committed and good humoured teaching and support staff together with an oversubscribed school population of approaching 1500 students. Our curriculum is broad and balanced and aims to meet the differing needs of students. Students follow the National Curriculum at Key Stage 3 including learning two modern foreign languages. Towards the end of Key Stage 3 students are supported with the selection of their GCSE options and the school works hard to ensure every student is able to study the subjects they have chosen.

Our Key Stage 4 curriculum provides an appropriate mix of GCSE subjects including English Language and English Literature, Maths and Single Sciences, Humanities, Languages, Art, Drama, Music, Technology, Computing, Business, Psychology and Philosophy and Religion. Students can also opt for more vocational subjects such as Creative iMedia, Leisure and Tourism and Child Development. Standards are very high; students make good progress and many departments have results above the national average.

The Sixth Form is an undoubted strength of Furze Platt Senior, with around 300 students. The broad curriculum offer and high standard of teaching has led to excellent examination results. A very large number of sixth formers progress to highly rated apprenticeships and university. Sixth Form students are also expected to undertake community work in or out of school, including paired reading and maths schemes, and acting as subject prefects or mentors. They make a significant contribution to the school.

#### Main Responsibilities:

- 1. Ensure classes enter and exit in an orderly fashion, taking appropriate action with the school's behaviour policy.
- 2. Ensure students sit according to the teacher's seating plan.
- 3. Complete the class register.
- 4. Instruct students about the work set by the teacher, ensuring understanding of the task set. This may include but is not limited to talking through a Power Point, showing video clips, writing examples on the white board, reading through text with the class, leading a class discussion, organising group work, supervising PE and Drama activities and assisting students with the use of laptops.
- 5. Manage the behaviour of students whilst in the classroom within the guidelines of the school's behaviour policy, referring students with inappropriate behaviour to the Head of Department or Head of House.
- 6. Monitor students to ensure they are on task, working in a safe way and completing the work set to the best of their ability.
- 7. Collect and return work to the teacher as required.
- 8. Issue behaviour points according to the 'Ready to Learn' rules.
- 9. Ensure the classroom is left in an acceptable condition for the next lesson.
- 10. Email the relevant class teacher with any issues.
- 11. Deal with immediate problems or emergencies according to the school's policy.
- 12. Perform duties in line with Health and Safety rules and to take remedial action where hazards are identified. Where a hazard is serious report to a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) immediately.

#### OTHER

- Assume the role of form tutor in their absence and follow the guidelines set out in the staff guide under Tutor Time Activities.
- 2. Assist the Administration Team with ad-hoc tasks such as student filing, confidential shredding or other suitable tasks.
