The Key Stage 3 curriculum has been designed to develop pupils' curiosity and fascination about the world and its people that will hopefully remain with them for the rest of their lives.

We aim to develop the use of new technology and GIS, such as Digimap, and believe that these are important skills for our students to develop. This is further supported by fieldwork opportunities including a visit to Kew Gardens and the London Zoo to learn about biodiversity and sustainability.
