Job Description and Person Specification

### **Our School**

Sarum Hall School is a busy and exciting, non-selective Preparatory School for girls aged 3 -11. We are located on the Hampstead/Belsize Park border in North London. Our award-winning, purpose-built premises are easily accessible from London mainline stations and close to a number of underground stations. Educating just under 200 girls, our School combines a wide range of opportunities inside and outside the classroom, with a strong academic foundation. The School is consistently at capacity and is oversubscribed year-on-year. Excellent teaching and learning, as well as a wide range of cocurricular provisions, is supported by strong and secure finances. There has been significant investment into the School in recent years, with further development high on the Governors' agenda. The School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

Applicants must be willing to undergo child protection screening appropriate to the post, including checks with past employers and the Disclosure & Barring Service. ### **The Opportunity**

The School is looking to appoint a Head of Maths to teach Maths to Years 5 and 6 and to oversee the teaching of Maths in the other Year Groups.

Responsibility for curriculum delivery, monitoring and the assessment of Maths across the school including EYFS, KSI and KS2.

Engagement in the development of cross-curricular opportunities within the Maths curriculum.

Management of the specialist Maths room, from which you will teach your lessons

Responsibility for Maths in terms of the 11+ preparation for Senior Schools (including Common Entrance preparation).

You will work with the whole school team to uphold the vision and ethos of the school at all times when liaising with staff, pupils and parents.

An ability to teach a second subject or contribute to the wider curriculum of the School is desirable.

# Main duties & responsibilities

#### **General**

- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons for who you are responsible and with whom you come into contact, with particular regard to e-safety policy and practice.
- Read the Staff Handbook and all relevant School policies.
- In addition to the following, you may also be required to undertake such other comparable duties as the Head requires from time to time.

# **Teaching**

- Plan lessons that reflect the curriculum with clear aims and outcomes with differentiation to enable all pupils to make progress in line with their potential.
- Teach effectively in a style which reflects the School's policies, objectives and ethos.
- Liaise with subject specialists/curriculum coordinators to maximise the effectiveness and continuity of the teaching.
- Assess record and report on pupils' attainment and progress at frequent intervals during the year according to departmental policies, and keep records of these.
- Carry out tests and assessments in line with School policy. Provide results for the Deputy Head Academic & Innovation and Head.
- Use assessment for learning effectively to inform teaching and planning.
- Use the information from above to plan lessons.
- Mark work frequently and instructively according to the department's policies.
- Maintain an attractive and stimulating learning environment for pupils that celebrates their work and achievement.
- Be aware of the varied needs and abilities of the children and reflect these both in the planning and the implementation of the curriculum.
- Be familiar with and support any IEPs of children if appropriate.
- Liaise closely with SENDCo on any issues concerning your pupils.

### **Head of Maths**

- Work with other staff to continue the development of the Maths curriculum throughout the School including in the Early Years.
- Ensure proper resourcing of the Maths department.
- Initiate opportunities for practical work within the Maths curriculum and liaise with the Deputy Head Academic & Innovation to develop these opportunities across the wider curriculum.
- Review and update the School's subject-related policies and development plan on a regular basis.
- Manage the School's Maths budget.
- Monitor long-term and weekly planning in liaison with the Deputy Head Academic & Innovation to ensure that there is progression throughout the School.
- Carry out an annual work scrutiny in liaison with the Deputy Head Academic & Innovation to monitor standards
  of teaching and learning in the subject.
- Liaise, advise and support subject teachers to maximise the effectiveness and continuity of the teaching.

# **Other Professional Responsibilities**

- Provide progress reports and information to parents via reports, assessments, parents' evenings and individual meetings. Maintain professional, appropriate and relevant communications with parents.
- Cover short-term absences of colleagues as requested.
- Prepare work for supply/cover teachers in the event of a planned absence.
- Cover duties such as early morning, playtime, lunch time and after-school duties, on a pro-rata basis.
- Attend staff meetings and INSET days and work with other colleagues on particular areas of the curriculum of relevance to your year group in order to provide a whole-school approach.
- Communicate effectively with the Senior Leadership Team (Head, Deputy, Deputy Head Academic & Innovation, Bursar, DSL), staff, parents and pupils.
- Keep abreast of best practice and developments in teaching by attending courses and reading relevant journals. Disseminate relevant information to staff on courses attended and current initiatives.
- Run a weekly club.
- Accept responsibility for discipline and behaviour throughout the School.
- Participate in arrangements to appraise performance.
- Ensure that Health and Safety at Work regulations are adhered to both personally and on behalf of the School.
- Update the risk assessment for your area(s) of the School on a regular basis.
- · Administer first aid if necessary.

• If working with an assistant, supervise, liaise with, motivate and assess them so that their time is used profitably and to good effect, ensuring that they are clear about their duties and responsibilities.

# **Pastoral Duties**

- Always treat the pupils in an encouraging and positive way.
- Be aware of a child's home circumstances and always apply diplomacy and a positive approach in dealings with parents.
- Observe and be aware of children who may have social, physical or learning disabilities and alert the SENDCo and the Head.
- Create a warm, caring environment in which children can grow socially, emotionally and intellectually.
- Be willing to be a Form Teacher.

# **Administrative Duties**

- Maintain a register of attendance using iSAMS at each session marked in accordance with necessary guidelines.
- Distribute letters, bulletins, etc. as appropriate.
- Prepare medium-term planning and weekly plans and keep the long-term plan up-to-date
- Plan and organise outings of relevance to the topic or the children's needs in accordance with School procedures in liaison with the Deputy Head.
- · Participate in administrative and organisational tasks related to the duties detailed above
