Darrington CE Primary School is a semi-rural village school in Darrington, 3 miles from Pontefract which is close to the A1, making it well positioned for local transport networks.

Set in beautiful grounds, Darrington CE Primary School provides a safe and stimulating environment for young learners. 'Peace', 'Friendship' and 'Respect' are the key Christian Values that underpin our Christian ethos. About Darrington CE Primary School

Darrington CE Primary School is a Church school much smaller than the average sized primary school, consisting of 4 mixed-aged classes. We converted as an Academy in September 2013, under the umbrella of the Diocesan Trust, now the Diocese of Leeds. Following a successful DfE bid, the school was allocated funds to extend our existing nursery provision in order that we can increase our capacity for nursery children and provide 30 hours free childcare for eligible parents of 3 and 4 year olds. This is an exciting new venture for our school!

Our OFSTED inspection took place in June 2015, and we secured a judgment of 'Good' with 'Outstanding' judgements for Early Years and for Behaviour and Safety.

"All pupils, including the most able and disabled pupils and those with special educational needs, make good progress in their learning. The proportion of pupils who make more progress than is expected is increasing."

"Parents hold the school in very high regard. During the inspection, many described the school as 'brilliant' and no parent expressed any criticisms of the school."

"The school is improving and standards are rising. In 2014 standards in Year 6 were above average and continue to rise. The majority of pupils currently in Year 6 are working at above average levels of attainment in reading and mathematics."

"The school benefits from strong leadership by the headteacher, the deputy headteacher and the governing body. Staff all work hard to help the school to improve."

"Leaders at all levels, including governors know the school inside out and thoroughly address any weaknesses that come to light. The school has a strong track record of improvement over the last two years and is well placed to continue to improve in the future."

"Pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development is outstanding. Behaviour is exemplary. Pupils are polite and helpful and relationships throughout the school are excellent."

Our SIAMS inspection took place in January, 2016, and we are proud to say that we are an 'Outstanding Church school':
