The successful candidate will be a passionate, skilled and inspirational Teacher of Music with leadership experience and a clear vision for the future development of the Department. They will be keen to promote excellence within the Music Department and expand our extra-curricular programme. They will be experienced in conducting an orchestra and leading choirs. Strong organisational and inter-personal skills are intrinsic to the role and an interest supporting the development of musical theatre in the School is necessary.
