The Department

The Mathematics Department at Caterham is large and very successful. At GCSE pupils follow the Edexcel IGCSE syllabus and the more able will complete the OCR Additional FSMQ or the AQA Certificate in Further Maths. In the Second to Fifth Years (Years 8–11) pupils are taught in sets.

The subject is popular and each year many pupils choose to study the subject at Advanced Level: currently 170 are following the A Level Maths course (AQA) in the Sixth Form including 50 studying Further Maths. Results at all levels are excellent.

Pupils are regularly entered for the UK Mathematics Challenges and Team Challenges, at junior, intermediate and senior levels and for the British Mathematics Olympiad as well as taking part in local maths contests: recently we have been winners of the Surrey Schools Maths Challenge twice.

A number of Sixth Formers have gone on to read Mathematics at both Oxford and Cambridge as well as other prestigious universities, including Imperial College, London and Warwick.

The department consists of 12 members of staff, including the Head of Department and a Second in Department.

Members of the department work very much as a team and are actively encouraged to show initiative, develop their own areas of interest, share resources and contribute to further developments in the department. All classrooms have interactive whiteboards and computers which are linked to the school network and internet. The maximum size of a class is 24. Students all have iPads which are used as part of classroom teaching.

The Role

Applications are invited for the post of Teacher of Maths with effect from I September 2020. The post is for one year with the possibility to become permanent thereafter.

We are seeking a teacher to:

- Plan stimulating and informative lessons, in line with departmental schemes of work
- Mark students work and tests regularly in line with departmental policy
- Assist with maths clinics and competitions
- Contribute to oral and written assessment reports for pupils
- Participate in relevant meetings and INSET
- Develop and improve ones own skills and knowledge within the School's performance management process by engaging in lesson observations, seeking pupil feedback and evaluating performance together with respective line managers in academic, pastoral and co-curricular areas

The person appointed will be expected to play a full and positive part in the life of the School. The ability and willingness to become involved in, and contribute to other co-curricular activities will be essential.

The successful candidate will be:

- A graduate with at least a 2.1 in a relevant degree
- Able to teach the subject throughout the full age and ability range
- Passionate about the subject
- An excellent communicator
- ♦ An innovator and problem solver
- ♦ Rigorous and have high expectations
- ♦ A good motivator and an optimist
- ♦ Able to work as part of a strong team
- Ready to contribute to the wider life of the school.
- A colleague who shares our view that wellbeing underpins pupil outcome and performance.

The post may suit someone new to the profession. QTS is not essential as we offer an in house training programme which can lead to QTS.
