Sherborne Girls

The School

Sherborne Girls is an independent, full-boarding and day school founded in 1899. It is situated on a beautiful campus on the western edge of the historic Abbey town of Sherborne and has an excellent academic record combined with first-rate facilities. It aims to give its pupils (aged 11 - 18) a broad and balanced academic, physical, social and moral education. The school has an Anglican foundation. Academic results are excellent at GCSE and A Level.

Neighbouring Schools

In July 2024, Sherborne Girls formed part of the Sherborne Schools Group alongside Sherborne Boys, Sherborne Prep and Hanford Prep. Drama, music, social and academic life are greatly enhanced by shared activities and resources. The range of subjects offered in the Sixth Form are increased by working in partnership with Sherborne Boys. A Level courses are available for our Sixth Form of over 180 girls.

Boarding

The boarders live in seven purpose-built houses: one for Years 7 and 8, five mixed-aged houses for Years 9 to 12, and an Upper Sixth House. Each house has a pastoral team comprised of a teaching Housemistress or Housemaster, resident and non-resident tutors and matrons. Girls eat all meals in their houses and the Personal Tutor system is house-based

Academic Achievement

We are proud of our academic achievements

and strive to give all our students the best opportunities for them to develop their unique potential. The curriculum is enriched by appropriate use of technology. We are a Microsoft Showcase Incubator school and all staff are provided with a pen-enabled Microsoft device for teaching. We offer an extensive co-curricular programme, a range of study days and external trips. However, our aims are broader than just to achieve excellent examination results, and although our pupils make progress significantly above expectation, we also want them to develop independence and other life-skills, talents and interests, along with respect for one another.

School Aims

The Department

The Drama Department consists of two teachers and a Speech and Drama tutor. It is housed in the newly refurbished Stuart Centre which includes a flexible studio performance space furbished to a very high standard, a workshop studio, a classroom and several smaller rehearsal rooms. The main productions are performed in the Gransden Hall (SG) or the BSR (Sherborne Boys (SB)) each year with smaller and examination performances in the Stuart Centre. Drama is taught for one period a week at KS3 and then an option at both GCSE and A Level, following the Eduqas specification for both. Co-curricular Drama is an important part of the department's work, including a joint senior school production and joint junior production (both with SB), a joint L6 play each summer and a West production each year along with other ongoing activities such as House Drama, House Dance, Tech Club and the Scholars' programme. Due to the full boarding nature of the school, rehearsals are always in the evenings and at weekends.

The Role

The appointed Teacher of Drama will be an outstanding and experienced practitioner, meeting all the requirements of teachers employed by the School including an ability to:

- Direct a school production each year
- Teach across year groups including the Eduqas spec up to A Level
- Assist with organisation of theatre trips and risk assessments
- Organise workshops for exam classes where required
- Assist with the Scholar's programme
- Assist with internal Drama events

Main Duties

- Plan, prepare and teach the course/s as directed by the Director of Drama and Dance
- Contribute to the co-curricular programme and assist with developing thisd further to best support the pupils
- Be aware of the diverse needs within any given class and to differentiate lessons and resources accordingly
- Understand and implement the aims and objectives of the Science department, and to contribute to its vibrant and creative atmosphere
- Maintain and develop, schemes of work within the requirements of the examination board
- Maintain sound discipline inside and outside the classroom, within the School's agreed procedure
- Ensure that the pupils' work is regularly assessed, that marks are recorded and that reports are written at appropriate times
- Write reports, attend parents' meetings and reply to parents' enquiries
- Ensure that pupils are suitably prepared for entry to the appropriate public examinations, and to implement and review the curriculum, to ensure that it meets the needs of the pupils
- Develop and manage up-to-date teaching and learning resources, including library and digital resources and advise the Director of Drama and Dance on course materials
- Assist with the setting, marking and, where necessary, co-ordination of internal examinations in the department
- Ensure the appropriate provision prior to and during internally and externally assessed NEA work
- Be aware of, support, and implement all school policies, including assessment and reporting, rewards and conduct, and those in place to maintain safe working practice.
- Observe and be observed on a regular basis as part of the on-going process of subject quality assurance, development of Teaching and Learning and as part of the Staff Development Review process.
- Develop ICT skills in the use of the Microsoft 365 suite of software for enhanced teaching and learning, for personal administration and to ensure pupils are effective in their use of ICT and show commitment to the School's digital strategic aims.
- Be a personal tutor to a group of girls and take part in lunch visits to an all-age boarding house.
- Weekend duties (approximately ten per year pro-rated for part time staff)
- One evening duty per week in a boarding house (6pm- 9.15pm)

Duties listed are not exhaustive; all members of staff are expected to undertake duties reasonably requested by the Head

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Person Specification

The post holder will need to be visible around the school and must continually review and improve our academic provision through maintaining excellent standards and supporting all staff.
