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LOCATION AND FACILITIES

A beautiful and functional space for everyone joining Woodlands.

We have wonderful, modern facilities including science laboratories, specialist classrooms, music rooms, a drama studio, technology rooms and an Atrium with Café.

All the classrooms are spacious with good natural light and equipped to a very high standard across all our curriculum areas. We are constantly upgrading our ICT provision and further enhance our teaching and learning with a well-stocked library, staffed by dedicated library staff within the Learning Resource Centre.

Our school is named Woodlands for a reason – we are surrounded by trees and green spaces and are fortunate to have extensive outdoor spaces for students to play and relax.

A high quality learning environment is very important to us, and we strive to maintain our grounds, buildings and facilities to high standards.

In addition we have a modern sports hall, fitness suite, swimming pool, two floodlit all-weather pitches, extensive sports fields and state-of-the art theatre facilities – all of which we also use to support our partner primary schools and the surrounding community.



THE ENGLISH FACULTY

The English Faculty at Allestree Woodlands School is currently led by a Faculty Director, a Deputy Director and an Assistant Director. The English team comprises eleven English specialists, including a Literacy Co-ordinator who leads on the whole school reading curriculum.

Our department has a suite of ten rooms in the main school which are used to deliver lessons across Key Stages Three, Four and Five. At Key Stage Three, the faculty has taken a lead role in developing new curriculum frameworks to reflect extensive changes to our incoming students' Key Stage Two experience and the challenges posed by the GCSE and A Level courses. Feedback from our chosen exam board (AQA) has consistently praised our robust moderation process, imaginative task setting and the breadth of engaging and perceptive work we enable our students to produce at 'A' level.

The faculty prides itself on taking a proactive approach in continuously developing programmes of study for the GCSEs and A Levels. At GCSE, we currently have 10 classes in both Years 10 and 11. All students are entered for English Language and Literature. In 2024, outcomes in Language saw 66% of students achieving at least a standard pass (Grade 4) with 49% of students achieving a Grade 5 or above. In Literature, 69% of students achieved at least a Grade 4, with 47% of students awarded a Grade 5 or above.

There is a high level of uptake of English at A level with every other student in the Sixth Form taking an English course. Currently, we have one English Language and one English Literature group in Years 12 and 13. In 2024, we achieved 100% pass rates in both Language and Literature. 70% of English Language students achieved A* to C grades. In Literature, 69% of students achieved A* to C grades.

We have established very strong links with both the University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent University. The English Department has a central ambition to be a training and development centre. Professional development for all colleagues is a priority. A series of trainee teachers have been successfully introduced to teaching at Allestree Woodlands School, several of whom have gone on to take up posts with us. We also have an established ECT programme.

This post offers the opportunity to become part of an extremely successful team of highly motivated and skilled English teachers. The English team enjoys an excellent blend of youth and experience, with half the team having taught English for over twenty years alongside the vibrant and innovative contributions of teachers in the early stages of their careers. There is also a wealth of examiner experience across the team which is a huge asset when preparing Key Stage Four classes for the challenges of GCSE. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to teach English Language or English Literature to A level. We are looking forward to appointing a dedicated, well-qualified English teacher who can make a positive contribution to a successful department which continues to enable students to fulfil their potential.
