The Post: Photography & Digital Media Graduate

We are looking to appoint an enthusiastic and committed photography and digital media graduate to support photography and digital media within a thriving and successful Art and Design Department. In addition, the role of the successful candidate will be to work alongside the three teachers within the Department across a range or classes from years 5 - 13, supporting the classroom activity that is taking place.

The successful candidate would be confident and able to work with small groups of students aiding and advising in developing their photographic and digital manipulation skills. In this respect particular emphasis would be placed upon years 10 -13.

Art and Design is a very popular and high achieving curriculum area at Wellington School, with many students each year moving on to a range of degree courses and careers in Art and Design post 18.

In this progressive and exciting department there is a strong and large cohort of students at both GCSE and GCE. From an early-age, students are encouraged to be creative and independent, and the firm ethos within this department is one of purposeful play, adventure, and exploration of artistic possibilities. Creativity and individuality are encouraged and much of the teaching has a college-based practice. Students can work in a wide range of disciplines and media on both large- and small-scale works.

This role would be an ideal opportunity for a candidate who might wish to develop a career as a teacher of Art and Design.

The successful candidate will be:

- able to enthuse, motivate and engage students
- confident in working with small groups sharing photography and digital media skills
- in touch with developments in photography and digital media skills
- able to work independently and collaboratively
- be prepared to utilise their technical skills in support of the wider life of the School.

Ideally, you will have:

- a graduate or postgraduate qualification in Photography, Digital Media or related discipline
- have a genuine interest in working with students in an educational setting
- previous experience of working/supporting young people

Specific areas of responsibility and key tasks include:

- Working within the Art and Design Department providing appropriate support to academic staff as required.
- Work with groups of pupils either supporting the class teacher or on occasions leading small groups in relation to photography and digital media activities. This could include supporting pupils in their lunchtimes or after school.
- Through supporting lessons, help all pupils to realise their potential.
- To prepare, supply and clear away practical materials across the department as instructed by teaching staff. This may include purchasing some materials locally, adapting items of equipment for use, efficiency of use and elementary day-to-day maintenance as well as disposal of waste according to CLEAPSS guidelines.

- Assembling and trialling equipment where required.
- Help ensure taster days, open days and Prep School theme days run smoothly.
- In conjunction with the Art Technician, ensure the department remain clean and tidy. All rooms involving practical materials must be tidy and locked at the end of the day, with all materials. Any dangerous equipment and tools must be suitably locked away at any point in which the rooms are left unattended.
- To carry out such other work as is necessary from time to time to ensure the smooth running of the department (e.g. photocopying or updating of displays in the Faculty and around the School).
- Any other duties as may reasonably be directed by the department.
