### About Hay Al-Sharooq International School

Hay Al-Sharooq International School is an independent educational LLC, fully owned by Oman Liquefied Natural Gas LLC (OLNG) and funded by the Omani Development Foundation (ODF). Together with Al Najah Education, a leading international education consortium with forty-eight schools and nurseries across the Middle East and South-East Asia who operate the School, all partners are committed to providing a first-class education for the children of Sur.



HASIS was founded in 2002 in a small facility in the OLNG compound to provide an education to the young children of locals and expatriates working for OLNG. At this location, the School grew from just fifty to over seven hundred children and in time provided an education for girls and boys from the ages of three to seventeen.

In the last few years, it became clear the School required a new, modern facility to take it to the next level, and HASIS opened in its new home external to the OLNG compound in September 2018. Today, HASIS is a carbon-neutral facility with the latest systems. The campus has been designed and managed to deliver an outstanding international education to our students and has current capacity for twelve hundred children in the future, with plans to open to the wider community in Sur in the near future. The School has additional space ready for future expansion as required. All stakeholders have worked closely together to plan, create and operate the School as a truly 21<sup>st</sup> Century educational facility with first-class provision of technology and design.

HASIS welcomes expatriate and Omani families alike, with students from over twenty nationalities whilst retaining a family and community atmosphere. The School follows a hybrid curriculum with elements taken from the National Curriculum of England and Wales, the IPC and IMYC from Fieldwork education and the curricular set by Cambridge Assessment International Education for IGCSE for all students. Omani children and expatriates of Arab origin also study Islamic studies, Social Studies and first language Arabic. The School is an accredited member of CIS, with membership of COBIS and BSME pending. We aim to bring the best of these diverse pedagogical traditions together to provide a genuinely holistic and stretching curriculum to encourage our current students to become future leaders.



### **Living and Working in Sur**

Sur is rapidly developing location, not far from the capital but still a piece of old Arabia at its best. Sur is one the oldest of the Omani cities and has played a prominent role in building maritime trade across the Gulf of Oman, Arabian Sea and Indian Ocean, forming business and cultural links between the Arabian Peninsula, India, East Africa and South-East Asia. Sur is the last location in Arabia where the traditional dhows are still built; they can be seen at use at sea daily.



Sur lies on the coast of the Gulf of Oman, boasting some of the best private beaches and unspoiled scuba diving to be found in the world, and is not far from extensive areas of mountains and desert which offer considerable opportunities for outdoor pursuits. There are several ancient monuments including Bilad Sur Castle, As Sinaysilah Castle, Al 'Ajah Castle, Finar Ras Al Meel and Ras Al Hadd Castle. Sur also lies close to several spectacular and popular valleys, the most prominent of which are Wadi Shab and Wadi Tiwi, and the protected beaches at Ras Al Jinz where several species of turtle lay their eggs.

In addition to the history of the area, there are rapidly developing modern amenities with new shopping facilities and malls, so your day-to-day needs are very easily met, with an excellent range of goods on sale. Sur is also famous for its food, and there are many excellent restaurants where local dishes and fresh seafood are served, together with a few more international locations for a taste of something more cosmopolitan. Other facilities include the OmanSail club with which the School has a strong connection, and the HAS Compound club which are staff may choose to join and enjoy the swimming pools, tennis courts, restaurants and bar, all of which is subsidised by OLNG.



By road, Sur is connected to Muscat, Nizwa and Salalah with Dubai and Abu Dhabi not too far over the UAE border, whilst East Africa, South Asia and the Mediterranean are a short flight away. Living and working in Oman offers a wide range of unique cultural experiences not easily found

in other parts of the Middle East. Flexibility, cultural dexterity and a sense of adventure are a must, but the rewards are great.
