In 2017 90% of our students achieved GCSE grades 4 and above with over 40% achieving 7 and above. At A Level over 70% achieved grades A*-C.

In addition to excellence in terms of academic outcomes, our purpose is to provide a supportive, stimulating and secure environment in which young people can thrive. As such we seek to employ inspirational and energetic staff, committed to the school's ethos. In return, we aim to provide opportunities for continuing professional growth and development for all staff, beginning with a well-established induction programme.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

Department details

The department will be staffed by 4 full time and 2 part-time staff in 2018/19, including the successful applicant. Staff have expertise in a wide variety of areas, and several teach a second subject. Curriculum responsibilities are shared, giving all colleagues the opportunity to be involved in the running of the department and to develop their leadership skills.

Facilities and resources

The PE facilities consist of a well-equipped sports hall, a small fitness room, a gymnasium, six tennis/three netball courts, a small field on the school site and a larger outdoor facility, walking distance from the main site. The school has recently established a partnership with Bracknell Town Football Club, as a result of which, lessons and after school fixtures and practices are held on the club's brand new 3G pitch. There are plans for exciting developments of our separate outdoor facilities which would become a 'sports hub' with an artificial rugby pitch, artificial football pitch, three floodlit netball courts and a 100m track and long jump area. In addition, the school hall is used for dance lessons.

Curriculum

At key stage 3 students are taught in single sex groups for some activities such as Rugby, Football, Basketball and Cricket (boys) and Netball, Hockey and Rounders (girls). They are then taught in mixed groups for Dance, Gymnastics, Multi skills, Tennis and Athletics. The program of activities widens as students progress through the school.

At key stage 4 all students have three core PE lessons per fortnight, and we offer a wider variety of activities, including those above and fitness, volleyball, badminton, ultimate sports, sports leadership, aerobics and handball. We are keen to encourage active engagement amongst all students and have very low non-participation rates.

We offer AQA at GCSE PE and generally there is one GCSE group in each year group, although we have two groups in one of the current year 10.

At key stage 5 we currently offer the AQA A level course and in 2018/19 there will be one A level group in year 12. In addition to continuing to offer A level, as part of our partnership with the football club and the proposed development of our outdoor facilities, we are looking to develop opportunities at key stage 5 for BTEC and coaching courses.

Extra-curricular activities

The PE department runs a wide variety of clubs at lunchtime and after school. Teams play in friendly matches, and in local leagues and tournaments and are often successful at district and county level. We encourage all students to participate in extra-curricular activities, and try to provide opportunities for the full ability range, including through our multi-skills club and House competitions.

Teaching and learning ethos

The PE Department aims to make a direct and positive contribution to students' moral, social, emotional and physical development over the course of their time at Ranelagh through a broad, balanced and relevant curriculum. In the department we always aim to provide a safe, supportive, stimulating and secure environment in which each student is respected, valued and able to achieve their potential.

We believe that effective PE teaching uses a range of approaches to support the progress of individual students, regardless of learning styles and ability. We seek to provide an environment in our lessons that is enjoyable, instructive and tailored to the needs of learners as individuals, emphasising

knowledge, skills, processes, pace and challenge throughout. Our aim is to educate our children to be confident, self- reliant, interested and knowledgeable in PE, and to use these skills in their study, and in maintaining a healthy lifestyle in the future.
