Introduction to Stoke College

Situated in 32 acres of historic parkland in a rural setting, the school is an idyllic environment, which offers our pupils a wonderful start in life. We provide an exceptional learning environment where emphasis is placed on outstanding teaching and the individual progress of all children. The College is a happy, welcoming and inclusive school. Our nurturing approach places the utmost importance on each child achieving their full potential.



We offer small class sizes of conscientious students, free staff meals and generous fee discounts for the children of our staff, both at Stoke College (Years 7-13) and our partner Prep School, Barnardiston Hall, situated less than 15 minutes away.

Our rural location offers staff a tranquil working environment within easy travelling distance of Cambridge, Colchester, Bury St Edmunds, Newmarket, Sudbury and the smaller towns and villages of Essex, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire.





Introduction to Stoke College

In the last five years we have seen a rapid rise in exam attainment as a result of thoughtful focus on teaching and learning, ensuring teachers have the space and skills to inspire our students free from the restrictive workload practices that have burdened teachers in so many other schools. Our quality assurance practices are rooted in trust and discussion, understanding that different subjects have different planning and assessing needs.

We opened our Sixth Form in 2017 and have gone from an initially small cohort to a September 2021 intake of 40-50 students in Year 12. Our Year 13 leavers have achieved places at high-ranking universities including King's College, London and University of Exeter and their success will be matched by that of our current Year 13, just our third cohort to complete their A Level studies.

In November 2019 the school was purchased by a board of four directors: Mark Wang, Baodong Shi, Josie Gao and Sherry Wu. Mark and Baodong are based in China, where both own leading secondary schools, while Josie and Sherry are UK residents who work in business and law, respectively. All four directors are committed to education as a force for good in a changing world, and all bring their rich experiences as well as their financial support as we grow Stoke College even further. In September 2021 we will expand our capacity in Years 7-9, growing to two-form entry (providing for a total of 30 students per year), making use of the classroom space vacated by our junior students who moved to our partner school, Barnardiston Hall, in September 2020. We offer 15 options subjects at GCSE and 18 at A Level, ensuring our students have the chance to follow their passions and play to their strengths to achieve their best possible results.

We are committed to giving our students an education to remember and as such encourage trips and visits and other enrichment activities, alongside a stimulating curriculum that makes the most of our campus and history.

The directors are committed to widening access to high-quality education and as such are funding a cohort of at least 20 Mark Wang Scholars into Year 12 in September 2021. Open to students from the UK and overseas, the scholarship programme will bring the brightest students from a wide range of backgrounds to our Sixth Form. At the same time, our 2+2 pathway enables less academic students to study two A Levels alongside the ECDL Level 3 and EPQ, thus enabling them to access quality higher education courses.

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This is a truly exciting time to be joining Stoke College, with our directors full of ambition for our remarkable school. We very much look forward to meeting you and sharing our passion for education with you.
