

# HEAD OF PSYCHOLOGY September 2019

Whitgift is one of Britain's leading independent day and boarding schools for boys aged between 10 and 18 years with approximately 1500 pupils and over one hundred boarding or flexi-boarding pupils. The School, which was founded in 1596 by Elizabeth I's last Archbishop of Canterbury, John Whitgift, is one of the oldest in Croydon and enjoys facilities of outstanding quality, amongst the best available nationally. It is set in an attractive 48 acre parkland site in South Croydon with excellent links to London, Surrey and the south coast.

## The Vacancy

We are looking for a well-qualified, experienced teacher to join a friendly, thriving school. The successful applicant would take up the post in September 2019. The successful candidate would be expected to teach Psychology in the Sixth Form. The ability to teach a second subject is highly desirable.

A Level Psychology is a recent addition into the Sixth Form curriculum and therefore the successful applicant will be able to continue the development of the department and inspire younger students to choose to study Psychology. The candidate will set high expectations for all students to ensure they fulfil their potential. They must ensure an outstanding quality of teaching and learning through observations, interventions, sharing good practice and continuous



professional development of staff. They should manage the progress of the students with careful monitoring and have good communication with parents and relevant Year Group Teams.



Sixth Form students can choose to study the subject either as one of their A Level choices or at Higher/Standard Level as part of the International Baccalaureate Diploma programme. Currently we have 21 boys studying A Level Psychology, which was introduced in 2015 (AQA specification). Sixteen boys are studying the IB Diploma. There are two classes in both the Lower Sixth and Upper Sixth, one per curriculum route. Students wanting to study Psychology as part of their A Level options are required to have achieved at

least a Level 7 in both Biology and Maths at GCSE.



The Department is well resourced with a dedicated teaching space and aims to extend the pupils' study and interest in the subject. We run a Psychology extension society, aimed especially at extending and preparing those students who wish to read the subject further. We also have a general Psychology Society aimed at those students in younger years to introduce them to the subject. Psychology students attend an annual student lecture series in London.

The successful applicant will be able to contribute fully to the above programme which offers excellent scope and resources for an enthusiastic teacher to develop and apply his/her skills and knowledge at all levels. A commitment to the School's pastoral system and wide range of co-curricular activities is also required.

### **Academic Results**

Academically, the Psychology Department has been successful. Last year at the International Baccalaureate level, 80% of students achieved Level 6 and above, whilst at A Level, 100% of students achieved A\*-C grade. The success of the subject has led to a growing number of students taking Psychology at Whitgift and an increase in the number of students applying to read Psychology at university.
