Role outline and purpose

The Head of Girls Sport will lead the Netball programme at LWC and all activites that are involved with Netball. Carry out the professional duties of a Head of Girls Sport being in charge of Girls' Athletics/Tennis/Cricket and coaching Girls' Hockey/Cricket/Athletics. In addition this role will monitor and develop Girls' sport throughout the College, co-coordinating the Girls' sport programme for the entire College and its fixtures in order to enhance the sporting performance, tracking and management of girls sport.

The Head of Girls Sport will work with the Graduate Sports Assistants and Heads of Sport to oversee professional aspects of our programme such as performance analysis, strength and conditioning, sports psychology and nutrition.

This role will take a lead into the strategic plans for the development of sport, sports coaching and high performance environments supporting our 2030 strategy and provide advice and support to all staff in their dealings with parents; to meet and advise parents on academic/ sporting matters.

The Head of Girls Sport will be responsible for the administration of Girls school fixtures, house fixtures and other invitational events in consultation with the Director of Sport, Co-Curricular and Heads of Sport.

The role will also have general communication management responsibilities around maintaining the VLE, SOCS, Twitter account (sport), publicising sporting achievements via the weekly newsletter, noticeboards and assemblies and updating the Girls' sport notice boards and website.

Role Responsibilities

- Coach a major team each term; attending Wednesday, Saturday and other fixtures as required, playing a full and active role in the College's activities programme
- Monitor and support the quality of coaching in all games and female pupil performance throughout the school
- Produce and implement safety procedures, in consultation with Director of Sport and the school medical team
- Provide input into the sports' scholarship programme, in liaison with the Director of Sport, Director of Marketing and other senior staff
- Continue to develop the outreach programme
- Actively forge links with all feeder school (esp. Prep and Primary) including visiting, coaching master-classes and sharing best practice
- Set up trips to schools in liaison with the Director of Marketing, Director of Sport and Senior Deputy Head
- Play a key role in the selection of squads at all age groups
- Play a key role in coordinating Sports colours, dinners and sports days
- General administration duties of Girls Sports programme, managing the budget maintaining sporting records, certain sport tours, risk assessments and Sutton Hall usage
- Take part in marketing and liaison activities such as Sports Festivals, Open Evenings, Parents' Evenings, and events with partner schools
- Lead on the development of LWC sports camps during the holiday period in liaison with the Head of Enterprise and Lettings, the Director of Sport and the Chief Operating Officer.
- Appoint staff to games groups in liaison with the Director of Sport, the Assistant Deputy Head (Co-Curricular) and the Senior Deputy Head
- Liase with St Neot's on their Girls Sport Programme, as part of our collaboration
