


ABOUT CREATIVE EDUCATION TRUST

We are a mixed secondary school, catering for children between the ages of 11 and 18 years and located in Wellingborough, Northamptonshire.

Since November 2018 we have been part of the Creative Education Trust. This has enabled the school to rigorously pursue rapid improvement for the children we teach.

The school boasts many facilities and we strive to provide an inclusive and expansive education for all of the children in our care.

SUPPORT FOR OUR STAFF

We are committed to providing our academy leaders with the highest quality support and challenge to ensure that their schools excel and give our students the education they deserve.

Our Principals and Headteachers have a good deal of autonomy as school leaders within a framework developed collaboratively with our Director of Education and our Director of Standards and Primary Education.

Each of the Creative Education Trust's schools benefits from a comprehensive programme of support and challenge, including working with former HMIs.

Creative Education Trust places a strong emphasis on CPD for teachers and for senior and middle leaders. We run a regular programme of training events to improve teaching performance and also provide focused **management** development and one-to-one coaching opportunities. We have an active cross-trust group on the Teaching Leaders programme and use Future Leaders and Teach First extensively.

We believe it is very important that each of our academies plans in such a way that financial and human resources are deployed to support their educational strategies fully. LOCATION

Wrenn School, Wellingborough, Northamptonshire

THE ROLE

We are looking to appoint for a new member of staff to join our Science Technician team as soon as possible. The post will be 15 hours per week.

The successful applicant will be working across both sites (London Road and Doddington Road).

REPORTING LINES

The post will report to the Lead Science Technician.

MAINTAIN THE DELIVERY OF TECHNICAL SERVICES TO THE SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

- Support and maintain system for notification of requests for practical equipment and materials.
- Prepare, assemble, set up and test materials, components, apparatus, tools and equipment for practical classes, examinations and assessments.
- Assist with practical demonstrations when required.
- Retrieve, clear away and store equipment and materials after use.
- Modify and/or construct simple apparatus using basic workshop skills.
- Provide technical advice and assistance to teachers, technicians and pupils, including assistance in practical classes where appropriate.
- Set up resources for new lessons and the preparation of equipment for 'themed' days.
- General maintenance, including cleaning and simple repairs of apparatus and equipment. Reporting or arranging repair of more complex faults and keeping appropriate records.
- Lock up stores and secure equipment when not in You use in find out more at:

- Maintaining stock levels within the department, carrying out stock checks and reporting any shortages. Assist in re-ordering if required. Make local purchases.
- Maintenance of chemical and equipment inventories.
- Under the control of the Lead Technician, coordinate the use of practical resources & facilities.
 Provide assistance & advice in meeting the practical needs of the science curriculum, including liaising with staff outside of the faculty
- To support the Lead Technician in ensuring the availability of suitable materials & equipment, helping to compile orders and liaising with suppliers. This includes sourcing, costing and suggesting economic alternatives to maintain stock levels. Maintenance of stock levels of consumables and inventories of equipment.
- Ensure correct use and simple maintenance of audio-visual aids specific to the Science Department.
- Liaise with reprographics department to ensure all reprographics requests are fulfilled when required.
- Filing of paperwork as required.

COMPLIANCE WITH RELEVANT HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS (INCLUDING COSHH, HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK ACTS, ELECTRICITY AT WORK REGULATIONS)

- Operate system for safe storage of equipment, apparatus and materials, including chemicals in accordance with CLEAPSS
- Maintain laboratories, storage rooms and preparation rooms in a safe manner, in accordance with departmental policy. Maintaining and recording regular laboratory checks.
- Maintain and issue apparatus, equipment and tools appropriately.
- Provide occasional advice and assistance to staff on safe working practices and problems related to Health and Safety, in particular on the use of apparatus and equipment.
- Actively contribute to the assessment monitoring & review of both Health & Safety procedures and information resources. Keep up to date with current procedures & practices through continuing professional development.
- Undertake safe treatment & disposal of used materials including hazardous substances and responding to actual or potential hazards in an appropriate manner.

 Provide remedial first aid for minor laboratory injuries or until a first aider arrives.

- Participate in development of departmental practical and technical facilities, including assistance in planning layout of new facilities and advice on specialised furniture, fittings and services.
- Identify equipment needs in consultation with teaching staff. Participate in selection of new items. Advise on best value suppliers.

GENERAL RULES / HEALTH AND SAFETY
