We offer students an inclusive, challenging and rewarding learning experience that builds upon a blend of National and Shanghai curriculum in younger years, transitions to a primarily English-taught IGCSE and pre-IB programme for Grades 9 and 10, and ultimately culminates in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme for all students in Grade 11 and 12. The A-level Programme was introduced as an additional pathway for Grade 11 and 12 in 2023, and will have its first graduating cohort in 2025. All our students benefit from numerous partnership programmes connected to Nord Anglia Education, as well as hundreds of extra-curricular activities which allow us to support our educational mission: **to cultivate a community of confident, unique, global citizens who embrace holistic, lifelong learning.**

CURRICULUM

Grade 9 curriculum is primarily taught in English and includes a blend of national and international curriculum. Global Perspectives is a required course that allows students to develop critical thinking and investigate a variety of global issues from multiple lenses. Students take all three core sciences in grade 9, which set the foundation for Co-ordinated Sciences in grade 10.

Grade 10 curriculum is a mix between a preparatory IB Programme and IGCSE curriculum. All students are required to take Co-ordinated Sciences and Global Perspectives. We also begin weekly CORE classes to support a strong foundation of critical-thinking and academic writing as well as preparations for the Creativity, Activity and Service Programme. The grade 10 curricular experience is designed to cultivate independent study habits, strong analytical-thinking and adept research skills to ensure students will succeed in the IBDP.

Grades 11-12 students are enrolled in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Students are held to the internationally recognized standards of the IBDP in all areas of schoolwork, including academic honesty, accountability, and the CAS Programme. IBDP course offerings vary on a year-to-year basis, dependent on the academic needs of our current cohort. We have also introduced an A-Level Programme to further support additional student needs.

ACADEMIC DISTINCTIONS

The NACIS Shanghai Scholarship Award is a prestigious award that acknowledges and celebrates exceptional engagement, impact and accomplishment. This award is granted to less than 1.5% of the entire student body.

Prefects epitomize academic excellence and exemplary leadership. Prefects are chosen from the top 10% of each year group, and two Head Prefects are selected to represent grade 12

Academic Excellence and Academic Progress Awards are given to the top students in each subject for all grade levels.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

The school year is a minimum of 180 days, running from late-August to the end of June. It is divided into two semesters and coincides with Chinese public holidays. The first semester report is released late January, and the final semester report is released in late June.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMMES

Well-being and growth, in and outside of the classroom, are prioritized at NACIS. We implement a variety of *Signature Programmes* to help support students explore their diverse interests and develop into excellent thinkers and doers.

The **ECA Programme** is a bi-weekly, period 8 after school programme in which students pursue their interests with the support of hundreds of community partners. These courses allow students to develop key skill sets for global competitions such as the Conrad Challenge, AMC 10/12, CTB, or allows them to engage in topics of interest such as Art History, Shakespearean Drama, and Model United Nations.

Signature Programs, Cont.

The Performing Arts at NACIS is a community-oriented department that supports students to develop in acting, music, dance and all aspects of theatre. Our partnership with Julliard and Trinity allows students to engage in high level courses and trainings and show off their skills on nationally recognized stages in Shanghai.

Our Global Campus Platform supports NACIS students to partner with other teachers and leaders across the Nord Anglia Network and join important global initiatives. Students engage in Eco-Schools discussions, the Newsroom Magazine, MIT STEAM Challenges, and pursue Sustainable Development Goals/ Social Impact Grant competitions to become actionoriented empathetic and globally-aware learners.

Our Global Expedition Programmes offer students opportunities to pursue their outdoors skills, leadership skills, and service learning. Students undertake winter sports in Switzerland, service-learning in Tanzania, or study exploration in Yunnan. These experiential learning programmes prioritize the importance of skill-building and leadership. Many students choose to pursue their **Duke of Edinburgh Awards** through these outdoors programmes.
