

Our results have traditionally been strong and we are consistently one of the highest performing departments in the school. Every member of the department has their own teaching room, complete with SMARTBoard, and all Maths classrooms are located along one corridor to enhance support and communication. In short, we are an open and friendly team who regularly share resources, ideas and cake!

Our recent GCSE results are below, but we are equally pleased with the progress that all our students are making across year 7-13. We are currently running A-level Maths, A-Level Further Maths and Core Maths in both Y12 and Y13 as well as offering Level 2 Further Maths to our most able Y11 students. We are proud that close to 50% of the current sixth form have chosen to study some form of mathematics with us.


