School Information - Waldegrave School

Waldegrave is a successful and over-subscribed comprehensive school for girls aged 11 to 16. Waldegrave introduced a sixth form in September 2014 which also welcomes boys.

The wider success of Waldegrave has been recognised in many different ways:

- Graded "outstanding" by Ofsted 2018.
- 71% of students achieved A*-B at A level in 2019
- 88% of students achieved at least 5 good passes including maths and English at grade 4 +; 50% of all grades were at Grade 7 or above in 2019
- Sunday Times Comprehensive of the Year 2016 and Parent Power Top 11-16 school in the country 2011-2015
- Designated a Teaching School (2011)
- Designated a Science College (2004)
- Sportsmark Award, Silver Artsmark, Healthy Schools Award, Eco Schools Award
- Investor in Careers

Staffing

The school has a staff of 88 teachers, 30 technicians and curriculum support staff, 22 administrative staff and 3 premises staff. School lunches, grounds maintenance and cleaning are provided through competitive contracting. There is a strong commitment to training and professional development, and the work/life balance of all staff.

Students

There are 1080 students on roll, plus a further 400 enrolled in the sixth form. In recent years the number of applicants for places at Waldegrave has greatly exceeded the planned admission number. The students come from a wide range of religious, cultural, social and ethnic backgrounds. Approximately 20% of the students are from homes where English is not the first language, and there are 43 home languages other than English spoken amongst the students. The number of students in receipt of the pupil premium grant is approximately 9%.

Student Academic Achievement

We are very proud of our results at Waldegrave and we will continue to aim to achieve the very best results possible. Our results have been consistently high year on year (see 2019 headlines above) but we have students of all abilities and we celebrate the progress of every student. Our Progress 8 score in 2019 was 0.83 and we expect a similar outcome when calculated for 2020. Click here for further information on our exam results.

Curriculum

The curriculum at KS3 and KS4 is broad, balanced and differentiated so that the needs of individual students are met. Students are placed into eight all-ability tutor groups in years 7 to 11 and these form the basis of teaching groups. The vast majority of teaching is mixed ability and there is very little setting at any age. Home learning is set regularly and seen as an important extension to the curriculum. We offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities such as orchestras, choirs, sports clubs, drama club and maths and science drop in sessions. Productions and musical events are a part of the school calendar. All students in KS4 and KS5 have a work experience placement. In our thriving and over-subscribed co-ed sixth form we offer an academic curriculum of A level subjects.



Pastoral System and Student Voice

The pastoral system at KS3 and KS4 is based on a year group support structure. Form tutors have the first responsibility for the welfare, progress and attendance of their tutor group. And they are led by a Head of Year and Head of KS3 or KS4.

In KS3 and 4 there are a range of forums that provide an opportunity for students to voice their ideas and to influence any aspect of school life: A Head Girl and her Deputies lead a team of senior prefects and perform duties on behalf of the whole school. We have an active school parliament who contribute to on-going improvements to the school. One of their current projects is to develop Waldegrave as an eco-school. The school also operates a house system which provides opportunities to gain leadership skills and also for students to come together and participate in competitive competitions and charity events or sometimes just for some fun.

Sixth form students are in tutor groups of approximately 24 students and tutors are led by Heads of Year and Head of Sixth Form. Students leadership roles include that of Head Girl and Head Boy who are elected to carry out responsibilities in relation to sixth form. Sixth form students participate in volunteer work and some run clubs or support in lessons on students in the main school.

Site and Buildings

The school is set in spacious and attractive grounds; we have our own playing fields within the I4.5-acre site. The school has received significant investment over the past in a new sixth form block, dining room and sports hall, and a refurbished performing arts centre. There are well-equipped specialist facilities and good staff room facilities. There are twelve science labs, several ICT suites and class sets of laptops available to book.

Information about PE and Sport at Waldegrave

We are a dynamic department who are as passionate about teaching and learning as we are about sport and physical activity. We collaborate and share good practice within the team in order to develop our expertise and knowledge while having positive impact on the learning outcomes of our students. We are open to trying new ideas and encourage staff to be innovative in their teaching. We are proactive in seeking CPD that can be shared and disseminated into the department. We actively seek out extra-curricular opportunities for our students to expand their experience of different sports and physical activity

This is a very successful department with many teams and individuals winning events on a wide range of sports in the last two years. Students are regularly selected to represent county teams and sometimes gain places in national squads. The department offers a wide range of extracurricular activities that included sports on a competitive level and also for students seeking physical recreation for pleasure and enjoyment. Students are welcome to attend any club regardless of ability. Please see our website for further details of PE successes, fixtures and results.

Accommodation and Resources

The department has large outdoor field space with 3 Netball courts. Indoors, there is a 4 Badminton court Sports Hall with store cupboards, a mirrored dance studio, fitness suite, a large well equipped staff office and a disabled shower and toilet. The Sports Hall was built in 2014 and the fitness suite and dance studio were refurbished in 2015. The department has shared use of a large Hall (also used for assemblies, Music and Drama). It is marked with two badminton courts and is also used for health-related fitness and dance.

Organisation & Setting

YEAR 7

All girls are taught in tutor groups of mixed ability - average group size of 29 2 ppw.

YEAR 8

All girls are taught in tutor groups of mixed ability - average group size of 27 - 2 ppw.

YEAR 9

All groups are taught in tutor groups of mixed ability until Easter. Students then follow either GCSE Short course or continue with Core PE programme - average group size 25- 2 ppw.

YEAR 10

Approximately 30-40 students opt to take Edexcel Full course GCSE PE. This is run in an option block where students have one theory lesson and one practical lesson each week.

All students have one Core PE lesson each week. They can choose to follow the Edexcel GCSE Short course for Year 10 taking the final exam in May of Year 10. All other students follow a Core PE/Sports Leaders programme.

YEAR II

Approximately 30-40 students opt to take Edexcel Full course GCSE PE. This is run in an option block where students have I theory lesson and I practical lesson each week.

All students have one Core PE lesson each week and follow an option block programme where they select the activity they wish to participate in for half a term.

Sixth Form

The Department offers A Level following the Edexcel syllabus.

Students in Year 12 and 13 can choose to participate in sporting activity during the enrichment programme which runs on a Wednesday afternoon. Activities run based on student interest and involve a mixture of competitive and recreational activities.
