## The School



Established by Tom Crombie in 2016, My Online Schooling (MOS) is one of the leading global providers of British online education. MOS delivers around 850 live, interactive classes per week to pupils based in over 80 nations worldwide. The school accepts pupils between the ages of 6 to 18 from any nation worldwide. MOS currently has over 1500 pupils, most of whom access their full-time education through the school.



A team of over 60 teaching staff deliver more than 25 courses to pupils over 11 year groups. The school has both Junior School and Secondary Schools and both divisions of the school are managed and taught by experienced, subject specialist educators. In the Junior School, children access the English National Curriculum. In the Secondary School, young people can access International GCSE and AS/A Level courses, sitting examinations in any one of our partner exam centres based in over 160 nations globally. Pupils are educated in classes of a maximum of 20 and, outside of lesson time, are set independent learning activities which are submitted to their teacher for meaningful feedback to support their development. All lessons are based on the English National Curriculum and the school has bespoke designed curricula which is suited to online learning.

MOS has two global bases. The EMEA school, and company headquarters, operates from Edinburgh, UK and provides access to any pupils based in North and South America, the UK and Europe, Africa, and the Middle East. The Asia Pacific (APAC) School is based out of Perth, Western Australia and allows pupils based in Asia, Russia, the Pacific, Australia and New Zealand to access live lessons.



The school invites young people from a range of backgrounds, for a range of reasons. Pupil profiles range from those with special educational needs or health and wellbeing concerns, expatriates, young elite sportspeople, young actors and those looking for British qualifications living outside the United Kingdom. My Online Schooling offers provision to young people on a full-time basis and those who are seeking a blended learning model in conjunction with 'mainstream' schooling.

Our Learning Support and Wellbeing Hub supports pupils with a range of special educational needs, and physical or mental health concerns that may affect their education. Pupils attending our Hub classes are taught by specialist teachers who work with them in small classes of a maximum of 10 pupils. Pupils are invited to enroll in the Hub exclusively, or to access the regular lessons alongside.

We were delighted to win the Progressive Education Delivery award at the 2020 PlEoneer in Education Awards, an International Education awarding body. The school is proud to be an organisation with progressive, 21st Century values and a school that values diversity and inclusion in our fast-paced, ever-changing world.

MOS has bespoke designed learning management systems, management information systems, and virtual classroom technology. We work in partnership with leading brands, iSAMS, Canvas and Zoom to deliver state of the art virtual learning to all pupils. We also have successful partnerships and working relationships with a number of other businesses and enterprises, namely, the British Council (Australia and Singapore), the UK Department for International Trade, Mind of My Own, Scottish Enterprise, Pearson and QA.

Although our school is a non-selective, our pupils continue to attain highly across the key stages. We are proud to share our recent 97% examination pass rate at the International GCSE stage (69.9% UK average) with 42% of our pupils achieving the top 9-7 grades (21.9% average). With our pupils experiencing their GCSEs and A-Levels, we are working with universities and further education institutions to support pupil applications to positive destinations around the world.

We are proud to support the holistic development of our pupils and embed Spiritual, Social, Moral and Cultural (SMSC) into our curriculum. Our pupils regularly participate in assemblies, house meetings, extra-curricular clubs and societies, and intercultural awareness days. These opportunities allow our pupils and teachers to build community and to develop the skills pupils will need for further study, life and work. We believe it is important for pupils to be prepared for a 21st century, where intercultural respect and understanding are fundamental for a better world.

## The Role



An Additional Support Needs Coordinator (SENDCo) is a key member of the Education Team and an integral member of our school community who has frontline responsibility for supporting the success and pastoral care of the young people who attend My Online Schooling.

#### **Purpose**

- To assist in the promotion, direction and oversight of high standards of teaching and learning, pupil achievement and progression through effective inclusion for pupils with special educational needs
- Be consistent in the delivery of all the School policies and practices
- Managing, developing and maintaining high-quality additional needs provision
- Observing pupils in the online classroom, to coach and train colleagues online
- Keeping all documents including records and policies, up to date and actioned, as appropriate
- Meet with parents to support additional needs and pupils' healthcare
- To monitor the quality of additional needs support delivered both by teachers and teaching assistants
- To support and maintain the additional needs register of pupils
- To ensure that awareness of additional needs issues is maintained across all of the teaching staff
- Be a role model for pupils through personal presentation and professional conduct
- Perform particular duties in accordance with school procedures to ensure pupil safety
- Model a determination to succeed and a positive attitude to your work

In the context of this job description, pupils with additional needs are deemed to include:

- Pupils on the School's Additional Needs Register
- Pupils with identified specific learning difficulties
- Pupils with identified social, emotional and behavioural problems
- Pupils with medical needs
- 'Looked After' pupils
- Pupils whose first language is a language other than English
- Pupils who the Head of Secondary/Principal considers have previously received, for any reason, an inadequate or compromised education

#### Areas of responsibility and key tasks

- Strategic direction and development of Additional Needs Provision in the School (with the support of, and under the direction of the Head of Secondary, the Head of Wellbeing and the Principal
- Exercise a key role in assisting colleagues with the strategic development of additional needs policy / provision
- Support all staff in understanding the needs of ASN pupils and ensure the objectives to develop additional needs are reflected in the school development plan
- Monitor progress of objectives and targets for pupils with additional needs from teachers' plans, evaluate the effectiveness of teaching and learning by work analysis and use these analyses to guide future improvements
- Analyse and interpret relevant school, local and national data and advise colleagues on the level of resources required to maximise achievement
- Liaise with staff, parents, external agencies and other schools to coordinate their contribution, provide maximum support and ensure continuity of provision
- Working with young people and families who will be taking external examinations and who may require additional assessment arrangements

#### **Teaching and Learning**

- Support the identification of and disseminate the most effective teaching approaches for pupils with ASN
- Work with colleagues to develop effective ways of bridging barriers to learning through
  - assessment of needs
  - monitoring of teaching quality and pupil achievement
  - target setting, including IEPs
  - developing a recording system for progress
- Collect and interpret specialist assessment data to inform practice
- Undertake day-to-day coordination of additional needs pupils' provisions through close liaison with staff, parents and external agencies
- Work with colleagues to ensure all pupils learning is of equal importance and that there are realistic expectations of pupils
- Consider the range of teaching strategies / equipment that could be utilised for pupils requiring specialist provision
- Experience with pupils studying at Key Stage 3 to Key Stage 5 in the Secondary School
- Experience with pupils studying examinations such as International GCSEs and A-Levels, or equivalent

#### **Leading and Managing**

- Provide professional guidance to staff to secure good teaching for additional needs pupils, through both written guidance and meetings
- Contribute to the appraisal process for identified staff
- Advise on and contribute to the professional development of staff, including whole school INSET provision
- Provide regular information to the Head of Primary, Head of Wellbeing and the Principal on the evaluation of additional needs provision and the impact on improving outcomes.

#### Monitoring, Assessment, Planning and Tracking

- To assist in the identification of pupils' additional needs through observation in the classroom, individual screening and assessment of reports
- To oversee the writing and regular review and updating of Individual Education Plans
- To liaise with external agencies in regard to particular pupils to ensure that the school is providing appropriate support for the child
- To liaise with classroom teachers concerning the needs and progress of individual pupils and to provide advice as appropriate about teaching strategies to assist particular pupils
- To interpret the recommendations of Educational Psychologists, Occupational Therapists and other reports and to disseminate them so that they are effectively implemented in the classroom
- To use data generated by school assessments effectively to inform future pupil progress
- Assisting in providing evidence for young people who may be required to apply for assessment arrangements with their exam centre

#### **Communication and Reporting**

- To write reports for parents on the pupils receiving specific teaching
- To liaise with parents and carers concerning pupil progress and concerns, and concerning updates to the IEP, and to be proactive in communication about these issues
- To make recommendations to parents concerning the use of external agencies for identifying additional needs

#### **Professional Knowledge and Development**

- To maintain a thorough and up to date knowledge and understanding of the current SEND Code of Practice and of the school's curriculum and policies
- To participate in INSET provided by the School and where appropriate to lead INSET on additional needs issues

- To ensure that the School's Additional Needs Policy is followed
- Complete successful cycles of appraisal as, engaging fully in the process with SLT to support your development as a professional



 Engage with professional learning platforms i.e. EduCare, as directed by the school

#### Other professional requirements

- Liaise with other school Additional Support Needs Coordinators as required
- Working with the Head of School and exam centres with regards to external examinations for pupils who require additional assessment arrangements
- Be aware of updates via the school management information system and continue to keep up to date

#### Safeguarding and Health & Wellbeing

- · Promoting and safeguarding the health, wellbeing and safety of pupils
- Actively promote safe behaviours when online
- Report all pupil wellbeing concerns via the iSAMS Wellbeing Manager
- Liaising with Health & Wellbeing team to support pupil wellbeing
- Report concerns to the Designated Safeguarding Lead, where necessary
- Regular participation in professional learning regarding safeguarding

- Knowledge of the range and type of interventions available and be able to apply these appropriately in the context of the School's resources and the individual child
- Knowledge of current educational issues and their relationship to the inclusion, behaviour support and Education Welfare Services
