CLASSROOM TEACHER

PRIME PURPOSE OF THE POSITION

Classroom Teacher is responsible for creating a positive and disciplined learning environment that gives authentic witness to the four Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) Touchstones of Liberating Education, Justice and Solidarity, Gospel Spirituality and Inclusive Community, both formally and informally, in the classroom, during co-curricular activities and when interacting with students. In this way each student will be challenged to grow in knowledge, faith and maturity according to his potential.

ORGANISATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS

The Classroom Teacher is appointed by the Principal and is responsible in the first instance to the relevant Heads of Department, the Assistant Principal Learning and Teaching, the Deputy Principal and eventually the Principal. The role holder will work collaboratively as part of a team.

The Classroom Teacher will

- Display a high level of professional competency and ensure that behaviour and personal presentation reflect the College's values and professional expectations
- Strive to live a lifestyle which, by its witness and example, is compatible with Gospel Values
- Be committed to self-development and ongoing professional development
- Be committed to building the St Edmund's College community
- Have knowledge and awareness of applicable Workplace Health and Safety and Risk Management requirements and Equal Opportunity and Anti-Discrimination requirements
- Respond to the operational needs of the College and to other duties as directed by the Principal or their delegate
- Contribute to the overall pastoral leadership of the College through active, and reflective participation in staff meetings
- Have excellent interpersonal skills and highly proficient IT skills.

2. Maintain an effective learning environment where the dignity of the individual is preserved

- Provide well prepared and varied lessons through the creative use of resources and technologies, which will cater for the range of students' abilities and interests
- Establish an appropriate program of homework
- Use assisted technologies when addressing the needs of students with special learning needs
- Make necessary adjustments when required, to programs and assessment items to meet the needs
 of inclusive education students
- Provide for a realistic and challenging academic standard of student performance
- Pay particular attention by responding to student work presented for comment in draft form.

3. Demonstrate a commitment to teacher professional development

- As required by the Queensland College of Teachers seek out and participate in Professional Development activities
- Mentor teachers new to the College and the profession
- If required, engage in professional conversations within the College and district schools.

4. Provide data required for the College assessment and reporting system

- Provide data on time, to ensure that the College reporting system in each subject area is
 - Appropriate
 - o Factual
 - Affirming
- Be available to attend Parent/Teacher interviews and when necessary contact parents promptly.

5. In collaboration with the College Pastoral Deans, act as a Home Room teacher

- Conduct the daily Home Room meetings and be present at all College assemblies
- Mark rolls daily and communicate information from daily bulletins
- Be a welcoming presence in the Home Room and playground
- Ensure that student diaries are maintained in good order and are used as a communication tool between the College and home
- Be in contact with the relevant Dean when the welfare of a student is compromised.

6. Be actively involved with Heads of Department in the administration of each relevant subject discipline

 - Writing work programs when required.
